

NEW BUILDING ACTIVITIES

Construction Operations for April Numerically Below the Gains.

DAYTON SHOWS BIG INCREASE

Rebuilding of the District Devastated by the Flood Gives Ohio City Lead Over Other Competitors.

Numerically more cities showed losses in their statements of April building operations than showed gains, though the excess is not great, \$1 out of 71 gaining and 40 decreasing, as compared with April last year. But because it is as a rule the larger cities that make unfavorable showing, the total nets a distinct loss. The building permits issued in these 71 cities, as compiled by The American Contractor, Chicago, aggregate a total of \$98,948,372 for the month as compared with \$90,897,259 for April, 1913, a decrease of 8 per cent. There is an honor roll, though not so lengthy as usual, Dayton makes a phenomenal gain, but that is because of the prostration, on account of the flood, of a year ago. Grant Orange gains 222 per cent. Albany, Ill., Chattanooga, 94; Ft. Wayne, 75; Memphis, 67; Atlanta, 46; Duluth, 37; Paterson, 36; and Seattle, 46.

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Rome Preparing to Celebrate Dante's 600th Anniversary. ROME, May 3.—Although the 600th anniversary of Dante's death is still seven years off, his fellow countrymen are already quarreling over what shall be done to mark the date.

Italian Dante Society has already issued the De Vulgari Eloquentia and the Vita Nuova, over which they took thirty years. The manuscripts are distributed among all the great libraries of Europe, and cannot be published completely only through photographing each manuscript page for the use of the compiler. It is computed that the publication would comprise twelve volumes.

RUSSIA WILL HUNT FOR EXPLORER SEDOFF

ST. PETERSBURG, May 8.—The government has decided to send the steamer Hertha and Andromeda and the motor ship Tatiana to search for the Arctic explorer, Lieutenant Sedoff, who started for the north pole two years ago, supposedly attempting the use of polar bears as draught animals. The relief expedition will be commanded by Captain Isolanoff. It will first proceed to the Pribratoff islands on the coast of Nova Zembla, and if Lieutenant Sedoff should not be there, the Hertha will take the steers from the Tatiana and fifty Siberian dogs and go to Franz Josefland, while the Andromeda cruises northward along the coast of Nova Zembla to Cape Galina, the Tatiana enroute returning to Archangel. In case of need the Hertha will winter at Franz Josefland, making expeditions by sledge and a hydroaeroplane. If these efforts prove fruitless, a store will be erected and the Hertha will return in the fall of 1915 to Archangel.

An expedition is also being sent to the Karae coast to search for Captain Krusenstern and Riissanoff, who are also missing.
