Mrs. Emma Hicken May Secure Bail

Arrangements for bail for Mrs. Emma Hicken, held under arrest at the Presbyterian hospital for the murder of Bruno Hansen several weeks ago, are being made, and it is expected that in a few days she will be at liberty until her trial. County Attorney Magney says he will accept a \$2,000 bond. Mrs. Hicken, after killing Hansen, shot herself. She lingered between life and death for several weeks, but finally rallied and now is almost entirely well. The tragedy occurred in the Presbyterian hospital, where Hansen was a patient. Mrs. Hicken and Hansen had deserted their families and eloped together last May, and returned to Omaha only a few days before the shooting. Responding because of her husband's refusal to take her back Mrs. Hansen bought a revolver and went to the hospital. The coroner's jury decided that she had killed Hansen and then tried to take her own life. Her own statement is that Hansen killed himself and that she tried to follow suit. Since the tragedy George V. Hicken, her husband, has been at the hospital every day waiting upon his wife. "I am going to stick by my wife until this trouble is over," he said to an official. "Afterward—well, I don't know. But I'm going to stand by her now because she's the mother of my boy."

POLICEMAN FORD PINCHES SELF FOR LAW VIOLATION

Policeman Emmet C. Ford, working in the office of the commissioner of streets, shot a duck on the Nebraska side of Carter lake, and the bird fell into Iowa. This occurred at 6 o'clock, sundown, and a squabble ensued between Ford and an Iowa game warden. "You're under arrest, come with me," said the Iowa officer. "Let's see your extradition warrant," demanded the Omaha officer. "I'll get a Nebraska officer to arrest you," exclaimed the Iowa man. "All right. I'm my own prisoner, answered Ford. Ford will go over to Iowa to see if he is to be penalized. He says the Iowa game warden is mixing up on the game laws, but to avoid argument he is willing to go to Council Bluffs, not under arrest, though, and see what it's all about. A federal game law prohibits shooting on a navigable stream after sundown.
