

CATTLE DISEASE IS WORST KNOWN

Emergency Appropriation by Congress May Be Required to Suppress Live Stock Epidemic.

TWO MORE STATES UNDER BAN

New York and Maryland Added to Those Now Quarantined—Outbreak Most Mysterious Experienced.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 4.—The worst outbreak of foot and mouth disease ever known in the United States is the department of agriculture's estimate of the live stock epidemic which has forced federal quarantine over six states and threatens a temporary reduction of the national food supply.

An emergency appropriation by congress may be required to finance the campaign to suppress the epidemic. Officials said tonight it would be a week before they could forecast the extent to which the food supply would be affected. They are inclined to believe, however, that the shrinkage will not be large in spite of the inconvenience in which stock growers and packers will be subjected until the disease is under control.

No Bess on Dressed Meats. Every possible effort will be made to remove handicaps upon the movement of live stock. The quarantine does not prevent the shipment of stock from uninfected districts to slaughter houses within the quarantined area, and there is no embargo against the shipment of dressed meat.

New York and Maryland were added to the list of quarantined states today. A department of agriculture statement announcing this said:

"The list of states now quarantined by federal authorities include New York, Maryland, Indiana, Michigan and Pennsylvania. In addition, restrictions have been placed upon interstate shipments from Ohio, although no cases have as yet been found in that state. There is reason to fear, however, that infected stock may have been sent into Ohio. If this is found to have been the case the embargo will be lifted."

Virulence Above Average.

This outbreak, which is the first in the United States since 1906, is regarded as the most serious of any that the United States has yet experienced. Not only has it already spread over an extensive area, but its virulence seems to be above the average. Vigorous measures will be necessary to stamp it out. The cost of suppressing the last outbreak in 1906 was estimated at \$200,000. In addition the loss to dairy and stock raisers was heavy.

Interstate shipments of cattle, sheep and swine are absolutely prohibited from the states now quarantined. Stock cannot even be sent from one infected state into another. The federal authorities are at present engaged in endeavoring to ascertain the exact area over which the infection has spread and as soon as this is known, it will, it is hoped, be possible to lift the quarantine from sections now included in it.

Most Serious Development.

The discovery of 600 infected cattle in the Chicago stock yards was regarded as the most serious development in the situation. Some of the disastrous effects of the outbreak there is believed to have been avoided by the embargo imposed last Saturday against the shipment of cattle from the Chicago yards to other states. Of somewhat less importance was the report that eleven cattle in the national dairy show in Chicago had been infected.

The outbreak in New York state occurred among half a dozen herds in the Buffalo stock yards. The disease was brought there, it is believed, by a shipment of nine carloads from N. J. M. P. the place of origin of the present epidemic, so far as known. One herd was found infected at Seneca Falls, N. Y.

Traced from Chicago.

In Maryland diseased cattle were discovered at Hagerstown. Inspectors of the department traced the cattle from Chicago. The same shipment left some diseased cattle at Green Castle, Pa., where another affected area now exists. In addition to the Green Castle area in Pennsylvania, one exists in Pittsburgh and several in the southeastern part of the state.

The diseased cattle in Michigan, so far as known, are located in Lenawee and Berrien counties. In Indiana they have been found in St. Joseph county, and in Illinois in Chicago and Wrentham. Even should the epidemic not leap beyond the boundaries already marked by it, some three months will pass before most of the quarantines now imposed will be lifted, according to department officials.

Plague Spreading.

CHICAGO, Nov. 4.—Closing of the Chicago stock yards in the fight against the foot and mouth disease was again gravely considered at a conference of state and federal authorities with cattle today. It was reported that the disease had spread further in the cattle pens and that 1,200 cattle were ordered killed immediately, and their carcasses destroyed.

The veterinarians admitted later that the disease was spreading at the yards and said that the carcasses of the animals located out for slaughter would be buried in quick time. The gravity of the situation was generally admitted and predictions were freely made that the yards would be completely quarantined by night.

Germany Reports Victory for Turks in the Caucasus

BERLIN, Nov. 4.—(By Wireless.)—Information was given out to the press from official quarters today as follows: "The first encounters on the Turkish frontier, in which Turkish soldiers met Russian forces from the Caucasus, resulted unambiguously for the Russians."

"Nineteen Russian transports, sunk by the Turks, had on board 1,500 mines, destined for the blockading of Turkish waters. This fact proves the hostile intentions of the Russians."

"The Gazzetta del Popolo says that the present treatment of Germany in England is a policy open to question. As numerous English industries are conducted by Germans, who would be difficult to replace."

Sherman and Roger Sullivan Running a Neck-and-Neck Race

CHICAGO, Nov. 4.—Lawrence Y. Sherman, republican, and Roger Sullivan, democrat, were running a neck-and-neck race for the honor of being the next United States senator from Illinois, according to incomplete returns from yesterday's election received up to 2 o'clock today.

Returns from 2,008 out of 2,788 precincts in the state outside of Chicago gave Sullivan 154,718 votes, and Sherman 196,677. If the ratio is continued Sherman's down-state plurality would be about equal Sullivan's plurality of 3,900 in Chicago.

Raymond Robbins, progressive, despite a vigorous campaign in his behalf by Colonel Roosevelt, is running a poor third. Robbins had the support of all of the Chicago papers and made the most vigorous campaign of the trio.

Apparently the only progressive victory in the state was in the Eleventh district, where Ira C. Copley was re-elected to congress.

The republicans elected all state officers by vast majorities. The democrats suffered severely in their Illinois congressional representation, losing ten out of the twenty seats held in the house. The republicans gained twelve congressmen, including six former representatives. Among these is former Speaker Joseph G. Cannon, who was defeated for re-election two years ago. He carried four out of the six counties in his district.

INDIAN MOSLEMS NOT WITH TURKEY

Aga Kahn Says the Sultan Has Lost His Position as the Trustee for Islam.

IS COERCED BY GERMANY

He Says Acts of War Are Not the Free Will of Sultan, but Will of German Officers and Other Non-Moslems.

LONDON, Nov. 3.—Aga Khan, who is known as the spiritual head of the Mohammedans in India, East Africa and Central Asia, has sent a cablegram from London addressed to the Moslems in India and other British dominions in which he expresses his deep sorrow that Turkey has joined hands with Germany in the war.

"In this message, Aga Khan says: 'This is not the free will of the sultan, but the will of the German officers and other non-moslems, who have forced him to do their bidding.'"

He declares further that Turkey has now lost its position as the trustee of Islam. It has drawn its sword in an unholy cause and the duty of the Moslem today is to remain loyal and faithful to their temporal and secular allegiance.

MORE GERMAN REACHING TURKEY

Several Hundred Officers Have Arrived at Constantinople, According to Report to London.

MOST FAMILIAR WITH ARMY

Great of British Capital Conciliatory in Tone, in Hopes of Bringing About Peaceful Result.

LONDON, Nov. 3.—A dispatch reaching London today from Constantinople says that several hundred more German officers have just arrived, though a majority of them, it is asserted, are familiar with the Turkish army organization, having been employed at the Ottoman capital before.

Turkey's formal entrance into war with the allies—for France cannot but follow Great Britain—came at a time when the Turkish ambassadors still at London and Paris were uncertain what next was to come.

An apology from the grand vizier for Turkish attacks on Russian ports, and doubt as to who held the whip hand in the sultan's government, together with the attitude of the Balkan states, were factors which, blended, seemed to carry such weight as to make Turkey hesitate. The London press was ever conciliatory in tone, hoping to the last that the mat-
