## WOMEN TO RESUME THE RELIEF WORK

Franco-Belgian Relief Association is Reorganized to Help the War Refugees.

TO PROVIDE EMPLOYMENT

Local society women have reorganized the Franco-Belgian Relief association of last winter and will hold their first meeting early in October. Mme. A. M. Borglum is the honorary president; Mrs. Warren Rogers replaces Miss Jessie Millard as president; Miss Millard is vice president;

Miss Mildred Rogers is secretary, and Miss Helen Scobie, treasurer.

Instead of meeting several times a week to sew for the war sufferers the efforts of the women will be rather toward collecting materials which will provide employment for refugee women on the other side. Meetings will be held only once a month. According to present plans the December meeting will be given over to sewing for local charities.

Small Sum Goes Long Way. Contributions in money will be received by Miss Helen Scobie.

"The small sum of 50 cents will give one-half day's employment to a refugee who can in that time make a mattress cover, the material for which will also be donated. Sometimes one mattress is all that a family of six or seven has for bedding," said Mrs. Rogers.

The line of work to be followed was outlined by Miss Grace Zorbaugh, general secretary of the British-American Young Women's Christian association at Paris, who addressed a meeting at the home of

Miss Jessie Millard recently. At the time Miss Zorbaugh was visiting her parents in Council Bluffs.
