Prominent Sugar Broker Succumbs to Poisoning Caused by Operation for Mastoids.

LIVED HERE FOR MANY YEARS

Harry L. Cummings, 3910 Harney street, sugar broker and for over twenty-six years a resident of Omaha...

A week ago, last Wednesday Mr. Cummings had to undergo an operation at a local hospital in order to secure relief from mastoid conditions precipitated by his illness.

Mrs. Cummings survives him. He is also survived by a brother, Charles, and a sister, Mrs. Charles Russell, both of whom make their homes at Kansas City.

Charles Cummings, the brother, arrived in Omaha with a nephew, Roy Russell, about the time death claimed the Omaha man.

Born in Cincinnati.

Mr. Cummings was born in Cincinnati, February 3, 1861, so he spent his fifty-fifth birthday in the hospital last week.

He was manager of the Russell Brokerage company, handling both beet and cane sugar for this territory.

George Not Inclined To Talk Prohibition With Judge Sutton

Others on the coaster were: James Crinin, Thirty-second and California; Carl Wyman, 3414 California; Russell Best, 508 North Thirtieth; Vera Bedford, 3415 California; and Eugene Hosland, Thirty-fourth and Davenport streets.

Losses Control of Sled. The steering bars were jerked from Oglebay's grasp and the hurtling sled left the track, headed straight for the pole.

His right leg was snapped at the knee and his body horribly twisted by the force of the shock. Warren Best, who was right behind him, was shaken up but otherwise uninjured, but Callahan, who was behind Best, suffered serious hurts.

Victims Pinned Down. When the sled hit the pole, it turned over on the victims and pinned them underneath. Physicians removed it and carried the victims to a drug store at Thirty-third and California streets, where Police Surgeon Miller gave them first aid.

All of the injured are doing well. Ray Richardson's injuries are not as severe

as at first thought. He suffered a fracture between knee and ankle. No internal injuries resulted.

Youthful Robber Holds Up Oil Man

A youth who had been loitering about the standard oil company's service station at Twenty-ninth and Harney for several hours yesterday afternoon, suddenly pulled a revolver and after compelling Joe Gorman, the clerk, to submit to being bound and gagged took \$12.50 from the cash register.
