LA FOLLETTE IN BAD SHAPE AND MAY HAVE TO GIVE UP

Senators Draw Up Statement for Him to Withdraw, and Meantime He Hunts for Two Months, Partly in Southern Europe

WASHINGTON, D. C., Feb. 5.—Senators Clapp, Bristow, Houser and other friends of La Follette met this afternoon. They prepared a statement proposing the withdrawal of La Follette from the presidential race on the ground of ill health. The statement was not submitted to La Follette and is withheld for the present.

La Follette is to rest for two months, then resume campaigning in April in April, touring the West. He remains here two weeks, then spends six weeks in Southern Europe. Senators Clapp and Bristow and Louis Brandeis will campaign while Senator La Follette rests.

Would Draft Roosevelt

COLUMBUS, Ohio, Feb. 5.—John Fischer, chairman of the Ohio Progressive Republican League, signed this statement: "If La Follette's illness necessitates his withdrawal I believe Roosevelt should be drafted into service. I believe he will not refuse the people's call."

Roosevelt Nebraska's Favorite

LINCOLN, Neb., Feb. 5.—A Nebraska State Journal poll gives Roosevelt more presidential votes than all the other candidates combined. He leads Taft 4 to 1. La Follette also leads Taft. Bryan is the democratic favorite, Wilson second and Harmon last.

Poll Favors Roosevelt

INDIANAPOLIS, Feb. 5.—The Journal presidential poll: Roosevelt 2,488, La Follette 1,614, Taft 1,331, Wilson leads the democrats by a big majority.

Not Fornist Third Term

WASHINGTON, D. C., Feb. 5.—Congressman Snyder of Texas moved that the house suspend the rules and pass his resolution aimed at Roosevelt that "the sense of the house is against a third term for president."

The house refused to suspend the

rules or pass the resolution by a vote of 83 to 59. Most of the Republicans opposed the motion.

NO IRISH WELCOME TO KING, OWING TO HOME RULE MIX

Orangemen and Catholics Alike Refuse to Officially Take Part in Ceremony of Giving Glad Hospitable Hand to High Briton.

LONDON, Feb. 5.—The Irish refused to welcome the king. Orangemen and Catholics alike would not participate officially in the ceremonies, owing to opposition to home rule.

Scores of mayors of England, Scotland and Wales attended, but no Irish. On the king arriving at Buckingham palace a thousand voices sang, "For He's a Jolly Good Fellow."
