ATTORNEY DENIES THAT HE ATTEMPTED TO BRIBE SUPERINTENDENT OF NEW YORK INSANE ASYLUM

ALBANY, Feb. 26.—Attorney John Anhut, who is alleged to have offered Dr. Russell \$25,000 to free Harry Thaw, appeared before the investigation commission today. He denied that he had said that Thaw had retained him, paying \$25,000, which was returnable unless he was released from the asylum.

"Where do I come in?" the witness said that Russell asked. "I won't do anything unless I get money." Anhut stated that he had told Russell that he could give nothing.

E. E. THOMPSON IS CALLED BY DEATH

TRANSFER MAN A VICTIM OF BRIGHT'S DISEASE—WAS MEMBER OF NEBRASKA BAR, AND HELD OFFICE THERE

After suffering several months with Bright's disease, Elmer Thompson passed away Tuesday at the county infirmary. Thompson was about 60 years of age, and is survived by a widow and five children.

Colonel Manuel Landa, a force of Huerta troops last night surrounded a building in Jaures, where a hundred Madrist volunteer were spending the night.

A machine gun was trained on the insurgents, and they were disarmed and sent to their homes.

Torreón is cut off from communication with this city. The entire state of Coahuila is said to be in revolt against Huerta.

With the withdrawal of the troops from Fort Bliss a single regiment of cavalry is left to guard the entire border from El Paso to Arizona.

MEXICO CITY, Feb. 26.—Brothers of Francisco Madero have made a demand in behalf of the ex-president's widow for his insurance. The dead patriot was heavily insured in an American insurance company.

It was learned today that the insurance company plans to ask the American state department to demand an official explanation of the death of Madero. It is possible that the com-

pany will endeavor to collect indemnity from the Huerta government. A rumor has been started to the effect that Emilio Madero has been shot, but this has not been confirmed. Emilio is a brother of the dead president, and he is reported to be defiant to the Huerta government.
