Marriage licenses were issued today to Stanley Pedro and Gertie Du Vell and Harry Brown and Winema Riddle. All are Indians.



### Making Jump of 24 Feet 11-2 Inches

Practically every track and field record on the books will be in danger when the athletes from all sections of the United States gather at San Francisco for the Panama-Pacific championships, early in August. No amateur performer in the list will be more closely watched than Phil Stiles, the broad jumper, who wears the colors of the University of Wisconsin in college competition. Stiles gave the athletic sharps a taste of his mettle as a broad jumper May 1, by making a tremendous jump of 24 feet, 1 1/2 inches—the longest running leap made since A. I. Gutterason won the Olympic championship for the U. S. A. at Stockholm three years ago.

Stiles is unquestionably one of the most remarkable young jumpers ever developed in this country. As a schoolboy he cleared 23 feet 9 inches, and he won the national broad jump championship from a big field, including Platt Adams of the New York Athletic Club, who is considered the greatest all around jumper in the world. The accompanying cut shows Stiles in action, as the top of his "rise" and about to consummate his great leap by plunging his feet forward an instant before they hit the turf.

### STEEL TRUST IS NOT DISSOLVED

**GOVERNMENT'S MOTION IS DENIED BY NEW JERSEY FEDERAL COURT—FEDERAL TRADE COMMISSION MAY CONTROL**

TRENTON, N. J., June 3.—The federal court today unanimously denied the government's motion asking for an injunction and dissolution of the steel corporation.

The court held that the corporation should not be dissolved, and that it had not committed a violation of the Sherman law.

It was admitted that certain price fixing agreements followed the famous "Gary dinners," but these were abandoned before the bill was filed.

Should the price fixing agreements be renewed, the court suggests that the corporation be placed under control of the federal trade commission.
