What the War Moves Mean

NEW YORK, Nov. 5.—Premier Asquith's very significant revelations Tuesday in the house of commons, concerning the progress of the war, showed that 1,000,000 British were engaged in the recent offensive on the western front, and that the nation's burdens are serious. If 1,000,000 British could not pierce the German lines six weeks ago, it is difficult to believe that the western deadlock will ever be broken.

There is no question about the bravery and tenacity of the British. But the more these qualities are emphasized, the less hope there is that it is humanly possible to overcome the deadlock by force of arms.

Efforts to break this deadlock cannot be indefinitely continued, because of the approach of financial exhaustion. And when Asquith urged the nation to practice every private economy, he meant that the people ought to save more, in order that they may be taxed more heavily later and subscribe to future loans, also.

If the world's richest empire is compelled to take a gloomy view of her finances, the plight of other belligerents must undoubtedly be equally serious. Therefore, it is more probable than ever that peace will come out of the gradual financial exhaustion of the belligerents.

Twenty pupils of St. John's Parochial school at Peabody, Mass., lost their lives when fire destroyed the building on Thursday. Over a hundred were injured. The fire, which started a few minutes after the morning session had opened, swept through the three-story brick and wooden school building in less than five minutes. Trapped on the upper floors or caught behind a door, which, opening inward, was jammed shut in the panic, the children were burned, suffocated or trampled to death or crushed by leaping

Second 300-Egg Hen Is at Agricultural College

(Herald Special Service) OREGON AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE, Corvallis, Nov. 5.—With a record of 301 eggs in 365 days, another hen, produced by selective breeding at the Oregon Agricultural College, has succeeded in reaching the coveted position of a 300-egg producer—the second whose official record has been announced to the world. A few years ago it was considered impossible that a hen should produce 300 eggs a year, since the average hen in the United States produces about 72 eggs annually. About two

years ago one of the college pen of selected layers astonished the world by producing 303 eggs in a year. Just before that another of the same breeding had made a record of 291 eggs, and this hen is a grandmother of the new record hen at the college, known as E-115. The mother of the new 300-egg hen had also made a world's record by producing 334 eggs in four consecutive years, an average of 217 eggs per year for four years. Another member of the same family has made a record of 286 eggs. Two other hens are well above 200, and are in

excellent position to equal or surpass the earlier record of 303 eggs. "The noteworthy feature of these records is that they are the result of selective breeding for eggs, and eggs alone, carried on at the Oregon station for a number of years," said Professor Dryden, in announcing the new records. "Hen E-115 is one of a flock of sixty of similar breeding that will finish the year with an average of more than 220 eggs. "This new variety has been developed by crossing different breeds, and has been given the name of Oregon."

CHILDRENS TRIP TO FAIR NEEDED

PRINCIPALS WOULD FREE STUDENTS FOR EXCURSION TO EXPOSITION, BUT HESITATE TO LOSE THE MONEY

United Press Service SACRAMENTO, Nov. 5.—There are a number of California school principals who would like to give the children a day of two off to see the Panama-Pacific exposition, but who

hesitate in doing so because the revenue of the school would be cut down, the appropriation of school money being based on the average daily attendance.

Many principals have written to the state department of education, asking if there is any way to give the children a day at the exposition, and still count them on the day's school attendance. Superintendent Edward Hyatt today said there is no way under the law.

"But," Hyatt adds, "the school directors could well afford to set aside a day or two for the exposition, even if the schools would lose a little money. A child can learn more at the exposition in one day than he can in a month at school."
