### CALIFORNIA NEWS

REDDING, Shasta Co., Dec. 22.—E. N. Todd, a stockman near Paulsen ranch, reports catching a forked horn deer that was held icebound in the middle of the Trinity river.

Todd believes the deer was chased by coyotes and ran out on the ice, breaking through when near the middle of the stream. The deer could not get out and was frozen in during the night, leaving only its head and a part of its back above the ice.

SACRAMENTO, Dec. 22.—The city commission here voted to extend to General Pershing an invitation to visit Sacramento. In making the motion Commissioner D. W. Carmichael referred to Pershing as one of the great men of the world. Pershing is expected to arrive in California about January 24.

WOODLAND, Dec. 22.—So much mystery surrounds the tragic death on the Wooster holding of the Conaway ranch near Woodland of Wesley K. Ellis, engineer, that Deputy Coroner Ross Wilson refused to hold an inquest on the premises and will require a searching autopsy into the probable cause of death.

YUBA CITY, Cal., Dec. 22.—Sheriff B. B. Manford of Sutter county allowed ten turkeys to settle the contested questions of their ownership. When the birds were loosed midway between the homes of rival claimants they all sought the coop maintained by W. A. Greene.

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 22.—Senator James D. Phelan has announced that he would submit to congress on his return to Washington a joint resolution for a constitutional amendment prohibiting American-born children of Japanese and Chinese parents from becoming citizens of the United States.

CHICO, Butte Co., Dec. 22.—What Policeman Jack Field termed was an attempt to kill him took place last night at about midnight when some men followed him from a cafe to the city park, where they beat and cuffed him into insensibility.
