CIRCUIT COURT

Circuit court will meet next Monday morning, December 5, when the new term begins. The jury drawn by Sheriff Low and Circuit Clerk De Lap last week were notified to appear promptly at 10 o'clock Monday.

The session of the court this week closed yesterday afternoon after the court instructed the jury in the case of Wood-Curtis Produce company against the Lamm Lumber company to find a verdict for the plaintiff amounting to \$74.55 the amount sued for.

The case of Fred Duke against J. Fred Morley, constable for the collection of \$60 alleged to be retained for expenses attendant on the return of a car belonging to Fred Duke, was placed at the foot of the December criminal docket. The other cases were postponed owing to the attorneys not being ready for trial.

Two suits for foreclosure of a sheepherder's lien filed yesterday by Timothy Dunles against Timothy D. Murphy and the Klamath Livestock Mortgage company, allege that the plaintiff has herded 3,000 head of sheep for the defendant Murphy since February 1, 1916 at the rate of \$100 a month. The sum of \$1,200, \$5 filing fees and attorney costs of \$250 in each case are asked.

Frank L. and Oscar A. Smith filed suit against L. D. Parks and William Norris alleging that a car repair bill amounting to \$39.75 remains unpaid. Costs amounting to \$5.65 and attorney fees amounting to \$25 are asked for.

MARSHAL JOFFRE WILL SOON VISIT U. S.
