American Legion News

Spirit of Abraham Lincoln Lives on in American Legion, Says Commander MacNider

INDIANAPOLIS, Feb. 14.—Abraham Lincoln typifies to every American the rugged honesty and high integrity we like to associate with our ideals for our country and its institutions.

The men and women of the American Legion, offering as they do, voluntarily, insurance to the nation for the preservation of its lawful government, have no other ambition than to serve as useful constructive citizens, than to be guided by principles of the man we honor.

Lincoln's endeavors were ever to strengthen the moral fabric of this republic to counteract those forces that weaken and destroy. He felt the proper care and consideration for the veterans who fought the battles for America's defense one of the most important and constructive forces to that end.

The American Legion has for its principal reason for being that America stay the way we fought that it might stay—American.

We propose to do this constructively—through education and example, through a real and righteous consciousness of our duties as American citizens that the principles of which Lincoln has given us such high example may be ever strengthened and maintained.

PORTLAND, Ore., Feb. 14.—Through the employment of the initiative next November, the Oregon Department of the American Legion will place upon the ballot, the most drastic measure ever drawn up to combat the Japanese evil which menaces the Pacific Coast states, according to announcement from Department Headquarters. Due to the fact that Washington and California have laws which partially handle the situation, the influx of the Japanese is increasing in Oregon and early action is necessary.

The Anti-Japanese bill presented to the legislature by The American Legion during the Special Session of 1929 was defeated through the efforts of the Portland Chamber of Commerce and others. All Western states will present a solid front on this vital question at the National Legion convention to be held in New Orleans next October, and get action of the National Legion organization, in order to bring the Japanese question through the National Legislative Committee of The American Legion to those who sit in Congress.

PORTLAND, Feb. 14.—Through personal canvass in which the legion auxiliary unit is expected to take an important part, a questionnaire will be placed in the hands of every vet-

eran and soldier whether or not a member of The American Legion by the Oregon Department, within the next twenty days. This is following in line with action of the legion officials at the recent National legion conference held in Indianapolis, Ind., at which time, decision was made for such a nation-wide campaign. By the information the veteran will give in answering its questions, the policy of the legion on many problems affecting the veterans will be formulated. The legion will ascertain the number of wounded or otherwise disabled veterans needing government attention or vocational training. The campaign will be thorough and of immense benefit to the country, particularly in planning for an organization to handle payment of adjusted compensation. The legion census will show, almost exactly how many men prefer the various options of the five-fold compensation bill. This census will enable medical experts to calculate how many men will need treatment and hospitalization in the coming years. The veterans' bureau will learn how many men need, are entitled to and desire to be trained vocationally. The Treasury and Navy Departments will be able to clear up a mass of unfinished business relating to allotments, discharge bonuses, liberty bonds, and reservist pay, etc.

The American Legion auxiliary in the various districts is expected to play an important role in assisting in the canvass through which questionnaires will be distributed and collected. The State Executive Committee of Oregon, will have charge of each district, the state being divided into five districts, and each post commander and adjutant having charge of the committee for their post area.

George R. Wilbur of Hood River will have charge of Crook, Deschutes, Gilliam, Hood River, Jefferson, Morrow and Sherman, Wasco and Wheeler counties; H. P. Pound of Salem of Benton, Lane, Lincoln, Marion, Linn and Polk counties; George A. Coddig of Medford, vice commander, of Coos, Curry, Douglas, Jackson, Joseph, Klamath and Lake counties; Oliver B. Huston of Portland, of Multnomah, Clackamas, Clatsop, Columbia, Tillamook, Washington, and Yamhill counties and Fred E. Kiddle of La Grande of Baker, Grant, Harney, Malheur, Umatilla, Union and Wallowa.

PORTLAND, Ore., Feb. 14.—During the first three weeks of the New Year, the circulation manager of the American Legion Weekly reported to Oregon State headquarters that 25,000 subscription cards had been received at their offices from the 100 posts of The American Legion in Oregon. State officials report a steady growth of members throughout the state and its memberships of 12,000 last year, it is anticipated will be exceeded by at least 3,000, bringing the state membership around the 15,000 mark. The weekly magazine chronicles happenings of legion posts throughout the world, and events of national importance and doings of the former ex-service persons in the service.
