TELEGRAPHIC SUMMARY.

The Price of Grapes.

SACRAMENTO, Aug. 14.—A convention of fruit-growers and vineyardists was held at Grangers' hall this afternoon to form a protective association of grape-growers to fix the price on grapes, and to prevent the wine-makers of San Francisco and other places from monopolizing the profits of their industry. After a long discussion it was finally decided to leave the question to a committee who will negotiate with the wine-makers to secure satisfactory prices for vine products, and if this scheme fails the committee will proceed to arrange for building a co-operative winery.

The Feud Revived.

LOUISVILLE, Ky., Aug. 14. Advertisers from Catlettsburg say the Hatfield-McCoy feud has broken out again. The trouble was stirred up by the sheriff, who went out to summon a witness in the Hatfield case, and was attacked. This was followed by a meeting Sunday between the Hatfield and McCoy gangs, since which three of the former have been killed and several of the latter badly wounded. More fighting is expected to follow very shortly.

Republican Congressman Bots.

NEW YORK, Aug. 14.—Congressman A. P. Fitch of this city has resigned his membership in the republican organization of his district. He says he is in favor of reasonable revision of the present tariff, in the direction of decreasing the cost of necessities of life, and supplying the American workmen with cheaper raw materials for manufacture. He is also absolutely opposed to any reduction of taxation on whisky.

TELEGRAPHIC SPLINTS.

The report of the city assessor of Spokane Falls places the population of that city at 10,300.

Mrs. Cornelius Vanderbilt was seriously hurt at Newport, R. I., yesterday in a carriage accident.

By the burning of a convent in New York City on Monday night, a loss of \$550,000 was sustained.

A large dynamite bomb was found yesterday on the Burlington track in Chicago. The police suspect the strikers of the outrage.

Some mail robbers have been caught in Chicago who have stolen upwards of \$100,000. Important developments are expected.

Elevator "A," in Peoria, Ill., is reported ablaze, and likely doomed to destruction, owing to broken pumps. It is an immense structure.

Thirty convicts en route for Siberia made a desperate attempt at escape on Monday night. Eleven were killed, ten wounded, and six escaped.

The supreme court of Washington Territory has affirmed the decision of the district court, pronouncing the woman suffrage law unconstitutional.

The "American" national party convened in Washington, D. C., yesterday, Ex-Gov. Isaac Sharp, of Kansas, called it to order. No presidential nominations yet made.

The relief committee of the infected town of Jacksonville, Fla., appeal to congress for pecuniary aid. A bill appropriating \$200,000 for the needed purpose is now pending.

In Newport the people had a time last evening on the harbor bill becoming a law without signature of the president. It appropriates \$150,000 for the repair and extension of the jetty at that place.

Charles Crocker, the Central Pacific millionaire, died yesterday, aged 67 years. He was hurt two years ago in a carriage accident, and never recovered from his injuries. He leaves an estate worth \$20,000,000.

William Davis, while confined in the city jail at Spokane Falls yesterday, attempted suicide by hanging himself with his suspenders, and then by running a darning needle into his breast. His conscience was disturbed by a murder he committed at a gambling table some years ago.
