The Lone Highwayman.

OLYMPIA Jan. 3.—The stage from Montesano was held up last night at Bush Prairie about three miles from this city, and the treasure box of the Northwestern Express Company and the mail bags were taken by the robber. No clue can be obtained as to the person as he was masked and his feet were muffled. He carried a Winchester, and the mail carrier not being armed there was no difficulty in making the seizure.

What Willamette Means.

The discussion of the origin and meaning of the word, Willamette in Oregon several years ago showed quite plainly that the proper name was Wallamet, and that it was of Indian origin. There is a tradition that some of the Indians of the Wallamet valley were separated from the Nez Perce Indians, and P. B. Whitman says that after he had learned the Nez Perce language, he found himself able to talk with the Tsalatin Indians of the Wallamet with very little difficulty. Hence he believes, that the root of the word Wallamet is the same as that of Walla Walla and Wallula, and to be the Nez Perce word "walata" which means "running water." According to Mrs. F. F. Victor, in the language of the Indians west of the Cascades, "wah" means water and "wah" to spell.

According to S. A. Clarke, formerly the Indians on both sides of the Wallamet, all of them being Calapooias, had many wars, but that many times wiser counsels prevailed, and they settled their difficulties in a peaceful way, or when they were completely worried out by their battles they did so for a treaty of peace. When they did so they met on the banks of the great river and made up their differences, and that hence the name Wallamet means "river of peace."
