

Phenomenally Cold Weather in
the East.

CARLIN PARTY REACH KENDRICK, IDA.

River Rising Again At Points
South of Here.

Intense Cold.

ST. PAUL, Dec. 1.—The weather in the northwest is phenomenally cold for this time of the year. Mercury touched 20 below zero here early this morning at the signal service station, while thermometers in exposed places marked as low as 28 to 40 below.

STILL COLDER.

ST. PAUL.—The coldest places according to weather bureau this morning, were Prince Albert Canada, 42 degrees below, and Bismark, N. D., 22 degrees below.

The Iowa Snow Storm.

CEDAR RAPIDS, Dec. 1.—Last night was the coldest of the season. The thermometer marked 12 below. Reports from the north and northwest show a like condition. At Estherville 13 degrees below, Watertown 24 degrees below, Albert Lee 18 degrees below. Yesterday's storm did not result in blockading railroads. Clear and cold today.

Carlin Party Arrives.

KENDRICK, Ida., Dec. 1.—The Carlin party, which was supposed to be lost in the Bitter Root mountains, arrived here safely with the exception of George Colgate, the cook, who fell sick and was left to die in the mountains. The party consisted of W. E. Carlin, a son of Brigadier-General Carlin, J. H. Pierce, brother-in-law of Carlin, A. L. Himmelfright of New York, and Martin Spencer, the guide. The party started to return home October 10, but as the snow reached considerable depth the horses were abandoned, and the party started down the river on rafts which they finally were compelled to abandon also. They continued on foot until November 22 when they met Lieutenant Elliott with a relief party from Vancouver barracks. The party was almost without food when rescued.

The River at Eugene.

EUGENE, Dec. 1.—(Special).—The river fell three feet yesterday, but rose again last night. It is now seventeen feet, three inches, and is slowly rising.

Opium Smokers.

JAMES FENNEL and Ed. Abbey were fined twenty and ten dollars here, this morning, for smoking opium.

THE RIVER AT ALBANY.

The Willamette at 11 o'clock was 27.3 feet above low water, and almost stationary, having risen only a little during the forenoon. It fell 4 feet at Eugene and 2 feet at Harriburg during the night, hence a fall is looked for here this evening. The U. P. wharf has been wrecked and the O. P. wharf considerably damaged. Otherwise no damage has been done.

Opium Smuggling.

PORTLAND, Dec. 1.—The principal witness in the Dunbar smuggling case was W. B. Jackling, who purchased most of the opium in British Columbia. The evidence was corroborative of that already adduced. Prosecution will probably occupy the entire day.

Hanged at Astoria.

ASTORIA, Or. Dec. 1.—John Reiter was hanged today for the murder of Victor Saelman, August 4, 1892. Both men passed the night at a farm house, where Saelman exhibited about twenty dollars in cash and a silver watch. The next morning both men left the house together, and two days later Saelman's body was found in the woods. The money, watch and Reiter had disappeared. Reiter was traced to Portland where, when arrested, he made a complete confession.

CORVALLIS, Or., Nov. 30.—The grand jury of Lincoln county at Toledo, found an indictment against M. M. Davis, Zephin Job and B. R. Job, for larceny of public funds. NEW YORK, Dec. 1.—The Erie Railway Company today defaulted on the interest on the second mortgage bonds. It paid the interest on the funded 5 per cent.

More Smuggling.

PORTLAND, Dec. 1.—The United States grand jury today returned sixteen indictments for smuggling opium. The names of the indicted are not made public. It is stated all are Chinamen.

LONDON, Dec. 1.—Advices from Rio Janeiro say there is no truth in the report that President Peixoto was assassinated. He is today engaged in repairing dangerous breaches in the forts and earthworks ashore. The dispatch contains the report that Mello left Rio with a portion of his fleet, to intercept vessels coming to Peixoto's aid. There was some desperate fighting between the rebel ships and forts at the entrance to the harbor, as Mello tried to go out.

STEVENS DEFENDS HIMSELF.

Mr. Paramount Blount in the
Toils.

A VICTIM OF QUEEN'S COUNSELLOR.

Sent To Hawaii To Give Harrison
a Black Eye.

AUGUSTA, Me., Nov. 30. Ex-Minister Stevens' answer to Commissioner Blount, regarding the Hawaiian affair, was given out last night. Mr. Stevens says:

"A deep sense of the obligation to my country and a minister's duty to defend an insult threatened against a struggling American colony, planted as righteously and firmly on the North Pacific Isles as our pilgrim fathers established themselves on Plymouth Rock, demand that I shall make answer to the astounding misrepresentations and untruths of Commissioner Blount's report on Hawaiian affairs. Not wishing to be severe on a neophyte in diplomacy, with no knowledge of the world's affairs, outside of his own country, sent on a very peculiar errand amid currents and quicksands entirely unknown to him, I say he has been in part the victim of circumstances, having been caught in meshes and snares adroitly prepared for him by the cunning advisers of the fallen Liliuokalani and the shrewd, sharp and long experienced British diplomatic agent, whose aim and hope Blount has served so well, and without the least suspicion that he was aiding the ultra-British interests even more than he was helping the Hawaiian monarchists.

HIS PLAN REARRANGED.

"It was clear enough from Blount's manner from the day of his arrival at Honolulu, as well as by his letter to the department of state, written soon after, that he had designed, at what ever cost, to repudiate the views and actions of the recently terminated administration, and that in order to do so he must impugn the action of the American minister and the commander of the United States steamer Boston. A total stranger, it was impossible for Mr. Blount to know how unfitting it was for him to take up his quarters where he was certain to be surrounded by royalists, and where the supporters of the provisional government would be reluctant to go. to the rival parties at different times, whether representatives of the queen or her opponents, my answer was always the same—that the force should not land until danger should be plainly imminent, and then only to protect American life and property, and to no one did I ever hint that I could or would recognize any but the de facto government, whether monarchical or republican, as I said in my letter to Secretary Greenham. I here affirm that the Royalists and their opponents had equal access to the legation and to its official head. The best answer to the baseless charge that I promised to use force against the queen is the order of Captain Wilts to his officers and men 'To remain passive,' and that no force was to be used, though the queen, through her ministers had strongly requested it hours before the provisional government was recognized by me and all other diplomatic representatives in Honolulu.

Stevens states that he had no knowledge of the meeting of the committee of safety at the residence of Henry Waterhouse, January 16, and that his first information as to the persons at the meeting was obtained from Blount's report.

MANY PAPERS QUOTED.

Regarding the expectations and hopes of the queen and her representatives, the exciting days of January 14 and 17, and the views and hopes of her opponents, Stevens quotes the queen's letter to him, the report of Captain Wilts to the navy department, and the order of Captain Wilts to Commander Selburne, to show that the landing of the troops was to protect the legation and the lives and property of American citizens and to preserve order. Continuing, the ex-minister says: "The copy of the call of the committee of safety, which Blount insinuates I wished to conceal from him, had been promptly forwarded to Washington in January, and was in the printed pamphlets of the state department documents, ordered published by the senate a copy of which I suppose Blount must have brought with him when he came to the islands.

BANKS AND BANKING.

The Bank of England manages the entire public debt of Great Britain, and its compensation for doing so has in some years almost equaled \$1,000,000.

The Bank of England was once compelled to suspend specie payments. It was on Feb. 27, 1792. It resumed in 1825 after the financial disaster following the French war had passed away.

In 1708 the Bank of England acquired a practical monopoly of the English banking business by the passage of an act prohibiting any company of more than six persons engaging in banking.
