## OPINIONS FROM LETTERS.

Hon. J. J. Whitney. "I will be at our convention unless prevented. I very much hope that the silver men will all parties will unite."

Hon. H. L. Barkley writes from Ohio. "I wish you well and the greatest success for the cause of humanity."

Hon. A. Frazier, Wasco. "There are plenty of silver men here who will join in the movement."

Hon. Harry Watkins. "Union of forces is what we are working for, and our state platform."

Hon. H. R. Kincaid. "While I do not expect to be present, I thank you for the invitation and assure you that I am heartily in favor of the principles you advocate."

Hon. J. K. Sears. "Upon a platform that covers and comprehends the financial question we can unite, organize and win. The people are ready. Here's my hand."

Hon. A. Hinman. "We will try to secure a delegation to meet you with the hope of a perfect union of all the silver forces of the state. Let the good work go forward."

Hon. T. R. Coon writes from Omaha: "I am proud of 'Old Yamhill,' and I feel confident her June victory will be that of Oregon in November. I will be at your convention, and Wasco will be represented. She is full of that kind of men."

Hon. D. P. Thompson writes: "He signed the call for the first Republican convention in Oregon, and was its candidate for governor in 1890, on a free silver platform, and is true to his principles."

Colonel Drake of Portland writes: "I called on Judge Shattuck, president of our League, and we decided to call a convention to elect 56 delegates to the McMinnville state convention."

## REPUBLICAN PLATFORMS.

See how they evolve from bimetallic into the gold standard:

1864—That it is the duty of every loyal state to sustain the credit and promote the use of the national currency.

1868—We favor the use of both gold and silver as money, and condemn the policy of the Democratic administration in its efforts to demonetize silver.

1892—We favor bimetallicism—and the use of both gold and silver as standard money—with parity throughout the world.

1896—We are opposed to the free coinage of silver—and favor the present gold standard (established by Cleveland and Carlisle.)

We favor the present gold standard—St. Louis platform. Gold and silver shall be money—constitution of the United States.

We favor international agreement—St. Louis platform. Congress alone shall have power to coin money and regulate the value of things—constitution of the United States.

## THE IDEAL PLATFORM.

Adopted at the Marquam Grand Opera House.

The ideal platform adopted at the McKinley ratification meeting Saturday evening last at Marquam Grand is as follows:

I believe in sound money.

I believe in honest money.

I believe in the money used by the most enlightened nations of the world.

I believe in a dollar that is a good as any other dollar, and a d—d sight better.

I believe in keeping this dollar on a parity.

I believe in international bimetallicism with the consent of the most enlightened nations of the world.

I believe in opening the Nicaragua canal within sixty days after the McKinley inauguration, with the consent of Great Britain.

I believe in the opening of the Columbia river to unobstructed navigation within 90 days after McKinley's inauguration with the consent of the most enlightened nations of the world.


