The Chemawa American.

The first number of the little paper by the above name is received. It is published semi-monthly by the pupils of Chemawa Indian school, and is an attractive little sheet. The heading is an original design by Wade illustrating the progress of the native son of America, from the teepee to the school and home life. The school is congratulated upon having this paper. It will add much interest to the work of the pupils, and give the public a far better appreciation of the work done by the institution. A few items of interest are given below from its columns.

The attendance at the Chemawa Indian school will be limited to 300 pupils this year, who will be taught all kinds of useful trades in the various shops, such as blacksmithing, carpentering, harness making, wagon making, etc., etc., as well as receive a thorough course of instruction in the school rooms.

Chemawa needs a telephone connection with Salem and Portland, and efforts are now being made to secure it. The Western Union Telegraph office recently established on the school grounds is a great convenience, yet for local business a telephone connection is even more necessary.

A new gymnasium, commissary, addition to boys quarters, and a new water supply will constitute some of the improvements for 1897. Keep moving is the watch-word.

There are 56 Indian agencies in the United States under the charge of Indian agents.

Congress has appropriated \$1,235,000 for the support of Indian schools throughout the United States and \$5,000 for the education of Indians in Alaska. Of the above amount, the Chemawa Indian school receives \$40,850 for the support of 250 pupils.

A Marion county deputy sheriff has been in this vicinity several days searching for a convict who escaped from the penitentiary at Salem about the 4th inst. The fugitive was tracked to Judge C. E. Moor's place, and there all trace of him was lost, though it is not suspected that he is stowed away in the Judge's cellar. At some farm in the north end of the county the convict worked for half a day and becoming alarmed at the prospect of pursuit, left suddenly, leaving his coat behind. He was about eighteen years of age, and was sent down from Umatilla county for forgery, and was a trusty at the prison. He is supposed to have reached Judge Moor's place about last Thursday or Friday.—Corvallis Times.
