WALLACE, June 28.--In the removal case against the county commissioners this morning, the defense filed an answer denying that they performed any of the material acts charged in the information, but alleged that all their official acts as county commissioners were performed in the interests of the people.

CHICAGO, June 28.--The latest recruits to the strikers at the stock yards are forty girls who asked for an increase to \$1 per day and upon the refusal all walked out. It is estimated that 1200 men went out today.
