

Bad Influence of American Newspapers Felt in Island of Luzon

Col. Here Takes a Town and With a Force in Pursuit of Insurgents -- Aguinaldo is Headed for Cavite Province -- Trouble Expected in the South -- American Army in the North Separated into small Commands -- General Young Heard From.

By Associated Press to the Journal. WASHINGTON, Dec. 8.--Ottis cables say: "Manila"--I am informed the outbreak of natives in the district south of Negros was the result of reported great insurgent victories in Luzon and Panay, which the natives believe. The extent of the outbreak is not ascertained. Lieutenant Lydard of the sixth infantry was killed, and two privates wounded.

One of our chief difficulties arises from the circulation of falsehoods among the natives, defamatory newspaper articles in the United States and Europe that are promptly published in Spanish and circulated in the Philippines. The insurgents have based all their hopes on false rumors.


A second dispatch says: The hospital ship Relief returned from Vigan bringing 270 sick soldiers, 232 Spanish prisoners, and reports several hundred Spanish prisoners at Vigan. Col. Here of the Thirty-third infantry took Bangued on the fifth inst, and is now in pursuit of the insurgents on roads southeast to Leyanto, thence to Bontoc, on which Aguinaldo and three hundred insurgents are supposed to be retreating. The transport Olympia has arrived. No casualties on voyage.

Aggie Going South. By Associated Press to the Journal. MANILA, Dec. 8.--The expectation of catching Aguinaldo in the north has been practically abandoned, and the probability now is that he will turn southward, if he is not already there with his destination Cavite province, his home, where the insurrection began, and where it still has its greatest strength.

The Filipino soldiers in that province have recently been showing increased enthusiasm and boldness, and captured insurgents say that Aguinaldo is coming to join them with a large army. The same belief prevails among the natives at Manila and elsewhere that Aguinaldo intends to make his headquarters in Cavite province.

FIGHTING RESUMED

Between the Boers and British Forces at Modder River Wednesday.

Buller and White are in Communication By Means of Heliograph--Reported Dissensions Between the Transvaalers and Orange Free State Men--Bridge at Modder River Has Been Rebuilt By the British.

By Associated Press to the Journal. LONDON, Dec. 8.--It appears that Pretoria has news that fighting was resumed on Wednesday. It is not shown whether Methuen advanced on a new position taken by the Boers, or merely engaged in a reconnaissance in force. Reinforcements are rapidly arriving at Mafeking to strengthen General Buller.

A dispatch from Buller confirms the statement that heliographic communication is fully established with Ladysmith, and Buller and White have been conferring as to future movements. The bombardment of Ladysmith was continued Thursday. A pneumatic dynamite gun on Umhalsana hill commenced the work. General Buller recently proposed an exchange of prisoners, especially Lady Sarah Wilson for

washed away should a heavy storm come. General Methuen has been obliged to move his camp a mile north in consequence of the unsanitary state of the stream, due to the presence of the bodies of dead Boers. As the railway bridge was completely destroyed, he was compelled to leave a considerable force to protect his communication.

A special correspondent sends the interesting information regarding Boer tactics that Commandant-General Buller has given general orders to reserve fire until the British are within the close range of 400 yards. At the Modder river battle, the free State burghers became nervous and opened fire prematurely, thus revealing their position and frustrating the Boer plans.

British Sentiment. The Morning Post publishes an article warning the British public that "the disillusionment already experienced respecting the Boer forces in Natal is likely to be repeated on the Western border. It says that men are wanted everywhere, and asks why the splendid body of naval marines is now being employed in sweeping floors and washing paint in England and is not sent out to handle the naval guns, instead of the hurriedly trained men, unfamiliar with these weapons, who have gone.

The government has decided to dispatch to South Africa at the earliest possible moment cavalry brigade of about 4000 men. Baron Loch, ex-governor of Cape Colony, and British high commissioner for South Africa, lecturing in London last evening, related some of his experiences with President Kruger. He said the remarks of the Transvaal president years ago showed that he contemplated just the state of affairs which had now arisen. Mr. Kruger even expressed a desire to have a sea port, and said the Transvaal hoped to have a navy someday.

The Times, commenting upon Lord Loch's reminiscences, says that they prove up to the hilt the Dutch ambition for Dutch supremacy in South Africa.

RUSSIA CHECKMATED. Japan Gets in the Confidence of the Palace Party in Peking.

By Associated Press to the Journal. SHANGHAI, China, Nov. 9.--There is a radical change in the balance of power at Peking. It was the expectation in the East that Russia would seize the opportunity afforded because of the British-Boer war to bring pressure to bear on the inflexible Peking regime.

This was attempted, but thus far it has utterly failed, for a third party has appeared on the scene, Japan is undoubtedly in the confidence of the emperor dowager, and Japan is utilizing the opportunity.

During the past week there has been a gathering of Japanese ministers at Peking. Baron Niishi has been appointed minister from Japan. He has had 15 years' experience as Japanese minister at St. Petersburg, and is among the leading Japanese statesmen.

M. Yano has resigned as minister to Peking, and at the direct request of the emperor dowager has been appointed "foreign adviser" to the Chinese government. Prince Konoyot of Japan, a man of mark, is also in China, being fanned and toasted by the leading viceroys.

In this connection it would be well for Americans to become familiar with the name of prince Tuan, of Peking, known as "the fifth prince." He seems to be the man who has brought about this cordial co-operation with Japan.

He is the brother of the late Prince Kuid, who was known as "the sixth prince." There are at Peking two opposing factions, each striving for the
