A FORCE POLICY

Abandoned in the Morocco Claims

SENDING CRUISER WAS A BLUFF

To Inspire Americans With Admiration at a Certain Point

WASHINGTON, March 27.—Secretary Long today cabled an order to Admiral Rogers, on the cruiser New York, at Tangier, to proceed at once with that vessel to Maulla, which is an abandonment of the plan to have the New York convey the United States Consul-General Gunner from Tangier to Mazar in an attempt to collect the American claims. It is the purpose of the State Department to endeavor to adjust these claims and other outside issues against Morocco WITHOUT ANY SHOW OF FORCE and in an ordinary practice of diplomacy.

New York, March 27.—Gratification is felt by the Navy Department over the successful voyage of the Mosquito fleet, enroute to the Philippines, says a Washington special to the Herald. This command consists of the gunboat Annapolis, the converted yacht Frolic and the tug Wompatuck and Picatagua. They have arrived at Colombo and are coaling preparatory to proceeding to Singapore, whence they will steam to Manila.

The vessels left Norfolk early in January and crossed the Atlantic by the southern route, creeping along the Mediterranean and down the Red Sea, making convenient ports where coal and supplies were secured. The progress of the little fleet has been watched with some anxiety but the fact of its ability to reach Colombo is regarded as an earnest of its arrival at Manila without mishap.

WASHINGTON, March 27.—It is said that the consul general has received assurances that the reason for the departure of the court from Morocco, was to pay a long due visit to another section of country. It was promised that the court would return within a month or six weeks and would receive the guarantee of the New York being badly needed in the east it was decided to let the vessel proceed on her voyage.

Price of Exporting Prunes is Lowered. SAN JOSE, Cal., March 27.—The California Cured Fruit Association has cut the prices of prunes for export 1/2 cent a pound. This is for the sizes from 40-60's to 90-100's, inclusive. The object of the cut is to put the exporter on an equal footing with the jobber of European prunes.

To Examine Turkish Mines. WASHINGTON, March 27.—Geologist J. E. Spurr of the United States Geological Survey has left here for Turkey under a special commission from the Turkish Government. He will among other things examine the mines owned by the Sultan and report on their value.

RUSSIAN TREATY

Affecting the Promise of Manchuria

REFUSED BY THE CHINESE

Minister Wu Makes a Bold Appeal for American Intervention

THE BRITISH ARE PLEASED

Over a Long-Waited-For Victory Over the Boers.

LONDON, March 27.—Officials of the Japanese Embassy confirm the report that an imperial decree was issued by the court at Siam Feb. 27 ordering that the Manchuria convention should not be signed March 26, the date fixed by Russia.

PEKIN, March 27.—The Chinese had not signed the Manchuria agreement last night when the time expired. WASHINGTON, March 27.—A dispatch was received here today stating that the British government had made a protest against China's negotiating a convention with any power touching territorial or financial affairs, until the present trouble in China was settled.

New York, March 27.—The Tribune says: Wu Ting Fang, the Chinese Minister who was in this city last night, seemed to be much concerned about the seizure of Manchuria by Russia, and inclined to believe that if other powers allowed China to be forced to part with the province the result would be the partition and dismemberment of China. His inquiries indicated that he felt much concerned and thought AMERICAN INTERVENTION AT THIS TIME WOULD BE THE MOST EFFECTIVE aid China could have. He said he had no information about the attitude of the powers toward China other than has been given in the newspapers.

TODAY'S NEWS SUMMARIZED.

It was reported last night that J. Pierpont Morgan has postponed the date of his sailing for Europe in consequence of advice received from Scotland Yard, London, which told of a plot against his life. Information has been received here which leads to the belief that Rodyard Kipling will return to America and be some summer resident at least, of New Hampshire. The name Sing Sing, so far as the village proper is concerned, is no more. Governor Odell last night signed the bill changing the name from Sing Sing to Ossining.

Governor Allen of Porto Rico is expected to arrive here early next week to confer with the President in regard to the political and commercial affairs of the island. The Steamer California, which sailed yesterday from Ponce, Porto Rico, for New Orleans, has on board 899 emigrants destined for Hawaii. The National City bank of New York will ship 1,250,000 francs gold to Paris tomorrow and 1,000,000 marks to Berlin Saturday.

A fire started in the republic, Mich., mine last night and today flames were raging through shaft. All miners escaped. At-Lois, Mich., high water is reaching an alarming point and is steadily on the rise until it is nearly up to the railroad bridge. At Huntington, W. Va., during a fire one fireman was killed and one seriously injured, while fighting flames.

Chicago and New York capitalists have secured a concession for a railroad through the northern part of Mexico. Of 15,000 bakers threatening to strike in Manhattan and Brooklyn on May 1, 5,000 have already struck. The bubonic plague situation at Cape Town is assuming a graver aspect. The proportion of European victims of the disease is increasing.

DESTRUCTIVE FIRE AT YAQUINA

Nine Business Blocks Burned Early This Morning.

An Albany special Tuesday says: Fire was discovered about 3:30 o'clock this morning in a vacant store room of Stark's store at Yaquina City, and it spread rapidly toward the south along the row of buildings, leaping from one to another until nine of the buildings were entirely burned, all in the row except Luger & Fretts's and Dr. M. M. Davis's stores at the end nearest the depot. The flames spread so fast that considerable of the contents of most of the buildings were burned, and it was only by heroic efforts on the part of the citizens that the C. & E. property and the rest of the town adjoining was saved from destruction.

The order in which the buildings were burned as follows: Stark's vacant store. Gorman's general merchandise store. Wade's Saloon. Meekers Meat Market. Castell's hotel. R. S. Scott's grocery store. J. Blazer's grocery store. Allen Parker's boarding house. The custom building.

The biggest loss was that of Gorman, who carried perhaps \$4,000 worth of goods. He was insured for about \$2,500. Some insurance was carried by nearly all in the row, though the rate is very high. The total loss is estimated at about \$15,000.

There had been a dance the previous evening in the Stark store building, lasting until about before the fire, and there is no doubt that the fire started in some way from the stove that warmed the room. The fire practically sweeps out the business part of the city. Just how much will be rebuilt is not yet known. It is doubtful though if all of the row is again put up.

Commission on Chilean Claims

WASHINGTON, March 27.—The Chilean Claims Commission promises to break all records in the rejection of claims. In all there were 18 claims present, 16 by the United States and two by Chile, aggregating something over \$3,000,000. Of these, eight have been decided and the total allowances are \$500,000 against Chile and \$300,000 against the United States.

One of the chief cases against Chile involved upward of \$1,000,000 and its disallowance makes an important reduction in the aggregate. The allowance in favor of the United States was that for an American citizen arrested in Chile some 50 years ago. The allowance in favor of Chile grew out of complications in one of the consular officers.

The most important case is that of the ship Itata, which during the Chilean troubles some years ago left San Diego, California; with alleged arms and contraband goods on board. Chile has made a large claim for this alleged breach of neutrality. The case will
