

FURNISH FACTION BOLTING GEER IN LANE CO.

No Marion County Republican Need Apply to the Kuykendoodle Statesman of Lane County--The Fight to Drive Governor Geer and His Followers Out of the Republican Party -- Reports Continue to Come in From Counties all Over the State Showing Chamberlain is a Sure Winner.

The following report appears in the Eugene Guard, and shows how the Furnish faction are treating the Republican candidate for senator: After Kuykendall had closed his address a gentleman arose from the audience and asked permission to submit some questions to the doctor. The doctor replied that he would prefer that the gentleman would defer his questions until after all the candidates had spoken, at which time he would answer any and all questions fairly and squarely.

"First: Are you in sympathy with and an advocate of the principles of the initiative and referendum?" To which the doctor replied, in substance, that he was. "Second: Are you in favor of the election of United States senators by the direct vote of the people?" To which the doctor said, "I most certainly am." Not being satisfied with this answer or with the doctor's quibbling, the question was put in another form: "I perceive," said the questioner, "that Dr. Kuykendall has not caught the spirit of my question. You say, doctor, you are in favor of the initiative and referendum, and that principle coming from the very hearts of the people, why do you not say then, if you desire to represent the wishes of your people honestly, that if Governor Geer should receive a majority of all the Republican votes you will support him?"

Here is what he said, crouching behind Mr. Travis, his opponent, with his hand upon his shoulder: "I will agree to support him, if elected, provided my opponent, Mr. Travis, agrees to support him, if he is elected." A general uproar followed the puerile evasion, and there would most certainly have been a climax had not our good old neighbor, Mr. Rigdon, the chairman of the meeting, realizing the disaster that would surely befall the doctor, for there were many Republicans on their feet ready to demand a straight, honest answer, suddenly adjourned the meeting. MASTER BUILDERS RESIST Demands of the Building Trades Council. Asks Unions to Handle Material from Unfair Mills. Injunction Against Strikers Dissolved.

Portland, May 28.--The strike situation is more complicated today than ever before. The master builders' association has refused to resume operations because the unions demand that all material must bear the stamp of the Union. Building operations are tied up more now than ever, and a hundred carpenters, plumbers and painters are idle. The master builders have contracts with the planing mills for material, and they cannot secure that material as long as a boycott is in against the unfair mills, hence they see no chance for resuming work. They are now trying to compel the unions to accept material from all the mills.

How this action of the master builders will affect the situation is yet to be seen. A like action was anticipated yesterday, but the labor leaders did not say how they expected to meet the issue. Union men seen last night are of the opinion that it will be regarded as substantially a lock-out, inasmuch as their union forbids them working with unfair material.

MARK HANNA IS IN IT Has a Clear Field in Ohio. Dictates the Republican State Platform. Declares for Reciprocity With Cuban Republic.

Cleveland, O., May 28.--A platform was adopted after Chairman Groveson closed his address. The first plank pays a tribute to McKinley, a re-enactment of the Chinese exclusion act is commended and the Isthmian canal favored. The trusts are denounced, and a reciprocity with Cuba is endorsed, as is the administration's Philippine policy. It says our flag in the islands is there to remain.

Subsidiary Coinage Considered. Washington, May 28.--The House, sitting in a committee of the whole today, began a consideration of the bill increasing the subsidiary silver coinage. The bill authorizes the secretary to coin into subsidiary coins all the silver bullion in the treasury purchased under the act of July, '90.

Paul W. Reid Burned. Paul W. Reid, an electrician employed by the Portland General Electric Company, met with a very painful accident on Monday, by reason of which he narrowly escaped losing his eyesight. He was in the act of turning on the power in that company's works when the fuse blew out, and his face and hands were terribly burned as a result, and he was taken to a hospital to have his burns treated. Fortunately he had his eyes closed when the accident occurred, and his eyesight was not injured.

MEAT FAMINE POSSIBLE Chicago Beef Tied Up In Stock Yards. Striking Teamsters Prevent Delivery. Movement to Close 1200 Retail Shops.

Chicago, May 28.--The possibility of a meat famine in Chicago is increasing. Packers managed to smuggle several carloads out of the stock yards this morning, but the striking teamsters prevented the delivery of the meat, either by persuading the drivers to join their ranks, or by forcibly preventing the delivery. Several riot calls were turned in, but no serious outbreak occurred.

Predicts High Water. Portland, May 28.--The Willamette river is still slowly rising. Foreman Official Edward A. Deas predicts that the lower Columbia river will rise quite rapidly during the week. At Portland a stage of 18 feet will be reached by Thursday morning, and probably 20 feet by next Sunday. At The Dalles a stage of 35 feet will be reached Thursday, and probably 37 feet by next Saturday.
