pany. Mr. Stolz moved that the committee on streets and public property be instructed to engage an attorney and investigate as to whether or not the mill company had not forfeited its rights and franchise to the ditch, by neglecting the bridges and failing to run water through the ditch at all times, and to report at the next meeting of the council. This was agreed to.

Favored Mr. Snowden.

Mr. Sims also reported the bad condition of Mr. Snowden's property on North Front street, and asked that some provision be made regarding the condition of the street there. On motion of Mr. Stolz the matter of the Snowden walk was indefinitely postponed.

The ordinance committee reported favorably on the application of A. Schreiber and Nusbaum Bros. & Co. for saloon licenses, and same were ordered to issue.

Aged Lady Injured.

Mr. Stolz, of the committee on health and police reported that Mrs. James H. Laughlin, at the Chatwin House, widow of a pioneer, aged 60 years, while passing along in front of the C. B. Moores' property on Ferry street, between Church and Cottage, stepped through a defective plank, had a severe fall, and is now under a doctor's care. She asks for \$150 damages, provided she secures the amount without a lawsuit. On Mr. Stolz's motion the matter was referred to the committee on streets and public property, to investigate and report at the next meeting.

Several Leaky Sidewalks.

Mr. Griswold reported that the high sidewalk on the west side of Church street, between Trade and Ferry streets, was dangerous, for want of a railing. The matter was referred to Mr. Griswold, with power to act.

Mr. Stolz also reported a bad sidewalk on Ferry street, at the Gesner property, and several other dangerous walks were mentioned.

City Recorder Judah read his report for the month of November, and it was ordered filed.

Report of Park Board.

The Park Board submitted its first report, as follows:

"There has been a warrant of \$50 received, and no expenditures up to the present date. Marion square has been surveyed, and park plans adopted by the board, at no expense to the city.

"The board asks that not less than

\$500 be appropriated towards the permanent improvement of Wilson avenue, for surveying, plumbing, curbing, laying of walks and filling, and a like sum of \$500 toward the permanent improvement of Marion square, to be used in the laying of walks, curbing and filling.

"In order to make a creditable beginning of the proposed work, the board will need double the amount for each park. Estimates made by competent engineers compel us to ask for more than we first thought necessary. Respectfully submitted.

No Suburban Lights.

Chairman Pohl, of the committee of fire and water, returned the petitions of the residents East Salem for three lights and those of South Salem for two arc lights, without recommendation, and they were ordered filed, without instructions, to present them when the next budget was made up. This matter brought on a discussion on the light question, several of the aldermen criticizing the light service.

The ordinance for the change in the grade of Court street, from 12th to Mill creek, was read the third time and passed without opposition.

Greater Salem Council.

Mr. Stolz suggested that at the next meeting of the council more members would be in attendance than the accommodations had been provided for, and he moved that the recorder be instructed to have the circular table taken to the city hall, and enlarged, so as to accommodate all the members of the new council, and this was agreed to.

To Enforce Poll Tax.

Street Commissioner Griswold asked and received permission to place a man at each polling place next Monday to collect poll tax now due, as no one will be allowed to vote whose poll tax for this year is unpaid. He was also instructed to take such other steps to collect the poll tax as he saw fit. Mr. Stolz moving that the street commissioner be instructed to take all the necessary steps to collect the poll tax.
