COMMERCIAL CLUB STAKE

Another \$2000 Horse Race Has Been Secured

The \$2000 Commercial Club stake has been guaranteed by the citizens of Salem for a 2:34 class trotting race, 3 and 5, for Saturday, the last day of the Oregon state fair. Only horses which were owned in the North Pacific circuit on January 1, 1904, are eligible for entry in this race, and all entries must close July 10, 1904. Entrance fee 5 per cent of stake, and 5 per cent additional from money winners, payable 2 per cent on or before July 10, 1904, when horses must be named, and 3 per cent September 1, 1904. Money will be divided as follows: 50, 25 15 and 10 per cent of the stake. The right is reserved to declare off and return first money if stake does not fill satisfactorily.

The committee, composed of Tillman Ford, John Conner, F. P. Talkington and J. L. Stockton, had no trouble in raising the guaranty in a few hours, and wired the officers of the state fair the result.

Profitable Peach Tree.

S. H. Horton, living six miles west of Monroe has the most remarkable peach tree in the state. The tree was planted 14 years ago, and has been bearing fruit since the third year, being so heavily laden this year that the limbs have to be propped to keep from breaking. It was simply a sprout when planted, and three years later bore a bushel of peaches, and the fourth year bore four bushels, and has been bearing out of proportion to its size each year since.—Corvallis Times.
