NANY IN PERFECT CONDITION

seems to be some difference of opinion, but supporters of Renterdahl represent a very small majority.

It is admitted that there are some defects in construction, but these are not considered serious enough to have caused all the agitation that has been aroused.

Inspection of every ship in the fleet by qualified representatives of the United Press Association confirmed the statement of Ingersoll as to the condition of the ships. Measurements were taken and observations made, and it was found that none of the ships lacked coal, none of the armor belts were submerged, none of the great guns were flooded during the cruise, none of the engines broke down, in any particular, and that the personnel of the fleet, fore and aft, was better than that of any similar fleet ever assembled under any flag.

With the flagship leading in single formation, the fleet arrived off El Centinela Island at 10 o'clock on the night of the 11th. Admiral Evans did not want to enter that night, and lay outside until the morning of the 12th. He had two days to spare, but early on the morning of the 12th he said to his chief officer: "Let us enter the bay at once. I call your attention to the fact that tomorrow is Friday, the 13th."

On the day of dark superstition, the fleet lay peacefully at anchor in the quiet waters of Man-of-War cove.

The mortality record of the fleet, naval surgeons say, has never been equaled. The percentage of deaths is so remarkably low as to cause amazement. With approximately 15,000 men on the ships, denied the regular living that is the portion of the landsman, encountering every variety of climatic conditions, subsisting in great measure on tinned goods, there were but five deaths from natural causes on the 88-day journey, one death being due to violence. Two deaths a month in a city of 15,000 would be considered remarkable, but this percentage is more fractionless than that on the great fleet of warships, which is looked upon as something almost incredible. Fears of wholesale desertions when the fleet arrives in San Francisco, and even before, is more than likely, and extra precautions

will be taken when shore leaves are given, to see that the boys return to the ships. That a great many enlisted for the mere purpose of making the trip is granted, and when they arrive at San Francisco it is expected they will take advantage of the first opportunity to get away.

LAWYERS QUESTION THE COURTS

(United Press Leased Wire.)

San Francisco, March 17.—Critics of the supreme and appellate courts, who have voiced publicly their dissatisfaction with the decisions of those two tribunals, in quashing the extortion indictments against Eugene Schmitz, are to be investigated by the Bar Association of San Francisco.

Members of the association will meet Friday night to initiate contempt proceedings against the offenders, if the criticisms freely made since the courts rendered their opinions justify such action. George J. Martin, secretary of the association, who sent out the call for the meeting, announced that the subject to be discussed in the attack made by newspapers upon the integrity of the courts.

It is thought that the association may also take action against certain lawyers who have accused the supreme and appellate courts of exercising poor judgment in setting aside the Schmitz indictments.

SAN FRANCISCO HAS NEW NEW IMPRESSARIO.
