OFFERED \$40,000 FOR OREGON MINE

The owners of the Raleigh copper mine in the Trail creek district, about 35 miles northeast of this city, were recently offered \$40,000 for the mine, but turned the offer down.

Last week two of the owners of the mine, accompanied by Dr. J. F. Reddy, who is also an owner, visited the mine. The two visitors, D. C. Burns and William Hart M. Hamilton, came from Santa Barbara, Cal., and were the guests of Dr. Reddy while in this city.

There is considerable development work going on the mine and prospects are becoming brighter every day. In fact, the prospects at the present time are such as to lead the owners to reject the offer of the English company of \$40,000 for the mine.

The work of developing the property is to be carried on in the future on a larger scale in order to determine the extent of the property.
