A ROAD TO COOS BAY ASSURED

L. D. KINNEY SUBSCRIBES FOR A QUARTER OF A MILLION DOLLARS' WORTH OF STOCK, WHICH MEANS THE BUILDING OF THE ROAD.

Eugene, Ore., April 29.—Word was received to day at the office of the Lane County Asset Company

from North Bend, where B. F. Kider, S. P. Ness and M. Svarvarud, have been working in the interest of the company's proposed line to Coos Bay from here by way of Siuslaw, that a subscription of 250,000 shares of stock of \$1 a share had been secured from L. D. Kinney, the local promoter of that place.

The money is subscribed on condition that it will be spent on the Coos Bay end of the line in making of surveys, securing necessary rights of way, terminal grounds, and in the actual construction of a railroad from Eugene to Coos Bay. It is further stipulated that Mr. Kinney may furnish rights of way, terminal grounds, materials or labor upon surveys or construction instead of actual payment.

A further requirement is that the

capital stock be raised to \$2,000,000, and that the company spend an equal amount of money at the same time to survey and construct from Eugene to Coos Bay.

This agreement practically means the immediate construction of the line. The Asset Company already has a crew of surveyors working west from Eugene, and options on right of way have been secured practically the whole distance. The company also proposes to extend this line, through to Springfield and up the McKenzie river, for which a bridge site has been located and a franchise in Springfield secured.

Klamath Falls has awarded a contract for the installation of a sewer system. The estimated cost is \$16,900.

Kern Accepts Nomination. Indianapolis, Ind., April 29.—John W. Kern today announced that he would accept the senatorial nomination tendered him at the state democratic convention here yesterday. His acceptance puts to an end the rumors current since the nomination, that he would not accept and that the party would be without a senatorial candidate.

WILL KERN GIVE PLACE TO TAGGART

INDIANA DEMOCRACY IS MUCH PERTURBED, AND THE OPINION PREVAILS THAT TAGGART HAS AGAIN OUTWITTED THE PARTY

(UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE.) Indianapolis, Ind., April 29.—John W. Kern, nominated by the Indiana Democrats as their candidate for the United States senate, refuses today to say whether he will accept the nomination. The nomination came just after Kern had made a statement that he would not be a candidate, and left the convention hall.

Kern's reticence today leads to the persistent rumor here that Taggart has again outwitted the progressives in his party, and that the Democrats will be without a senatorial candidate during the campaign, a condition which Taggart desired.

Should Kern refuse the nomination it would leave the Democrats in the position that Taggart desired. He fought Marshall's schemes to have a senatorial candidate endorsed.

Although it was believed that the long friendship between Taggart and Kern had been strained during the session of the legislature a year ago, when Benjamin F. Shively was elected to the United States senate, though many Democrats declared the honor should have gone to Kern, because of his race for the vice-presidency, it is now rumored that Kern may stay out of the senatorial race, and that the old Taggart-Kern friendship is as firm as ever.

The Kern votes started, it is declared, when Taggart rose in the convention and declared that the "old guard today is in the scrap heap." Taggart's followers are said to have passed the signal for the Kern avalanche, and the Taggart men fell into line.

Another view of the situation, however, is taken by some Democratic leaders. They declared that Taggart, seeing that the day was lost, so far as his own plans went, turned seeming victory for John B. Lamb, of Terre Haute, who had fought him, into defeat, by throwing his votes to Kern, long identified with Taggart. It is declared by these leaders that Kern will accept the nomination, but in the light of his withdrawal from
