## AT WORK ON PORTLAND PIPE LINE

THIRTY-THREE MILES OF NEW MAIN TO BE LAID FROM BULL RUN TO THE METROPOLIS AND WORK HAS BEGUN.

Wednesday morning things began to move lively at the yards of the Shaw-Batcher people in this city and the first carload of pipe was unloaded. The machinery by the manipulation of skilled hands worked well and as the work proceeded the large platforms received many lengths of pipe and by the time the crew was ready to quit work at night eight cars had been unloaded. This finished all the cars on hand but it is claimed that more could have been handled had they been in sight. Each car carries six lengths of pipe, and the eight unloaded Wednesday contained pipe measuring in length 1440 feet.

Thus starts practically the first work of the big contract which has aroused much interest and enthusiasm throughout this section of the country. The preparatory work of the company which is now nearly completed, has been handled by competent managers and as the pipe laying commences everything will move off as smoothly as clockwork.

J. J. Seaton, who has the contract to haul the water pipe for Shaw-Batcher, is in the city and yesterday was interviewed by a Herald representative. He has leased about four acres of ground from Fleming & Thompson near the high school building on the opposite side of the street, where he intends to make a yard for his stock, wagons, engines, etc., and his crew of carpenters are now erecting the barn on the site which will be large enough to accommodate 20 horses. Mr. Seaton states that he will have the use of two, instead of one traction engine to ply on the road and both will be in operation in a short time. The horse teams will also be used to haul pipe, switch loaded wagons for the trains, etc.—Beaver State Herald.

## TO OPEN YAKIMA RESERVATION

MORE THAN A MILLION ACRES IN YAKIMA AND KLIKITAT COUNTIES, WASHINGTON, TO BE OPENED TO SETTLEMENT.

Spokane, Wash., June 27.—More than 1,000,000 acres of Indian reservation lands in Yakima and Klickitat counties, in south central Washington, will be opened for homestead purposes next September or October, according to advice received by the Spokane chamber of commerce and the Yakima Commercial club from United States Senator Wesley L. Jones. H. P. James, secretary of the last named organization at North Yakima, is making preparations to handle the thousands of homeseekers expected to file on the land.

Senator Jones says in his letters that although no official proclamation has been issued, it is likely President Taft will attach his signature to the document in a short time, adding that recent conferences of officials of the land and Indian departments make the opening probable about the time mentioned. The opening of the reserve will be opportune, as the labor shortage in the orchard districts would be relieved to the extent of the number of persons going to work as pickers and packers.

It is announced that all the survey work on the reservation proper is completed, also that the allotments to the Indians and the apportionment of the surplus lands have been made. The timber land will be sold under sealed bids, the rest being drawn for under the lottery plan, similar to the method employed at the opening of the Flathead, the Coeur d'Alene and Spokane reservations in 1909.

The Yakima reservation comprises 1,145,000 acres, of which 100,000 will be opened subject to the Reclamation Act. The United States government is constructing an irrigation plant to water that much land. This land may be taken up in farm units, ranging from 40 to 160 acres, depending upon the productivity of the soil. The cost of the water right depends upon the expenditure on the canal and is prorated against each acre watered. The entryman has 10 years in which to pay for the water right, without interest on deferred payments. A small charge is made on each acre watered to maintain the canal, which is later turned over to the settlers.

## HE KILLED TWO AND WAS KILLED

W. H. BOSTWICK BARRICADES HIMSELF IN HIS HOUSE AND RESISTING ARREST KILLS TWO AND WOUNDS THREE.

[UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE.] Atlanta, Ga., June 27.—After killing two officers, wounding three others and resisting arrest for 24 hours, by barricading his house at Oscilia, Ga., W. H. Bostwick was shot today.

Bostwick killed Chief of Police Davis and Deputy Sheriff Sheffield and wounded Sheriff McInnes and Deputies Bass and Tucker, who were trying to arrest him at his home yesterday. He barricaded his doors and fired from the windows. A number of shots were fired at Bostwick, but the officers finally retreated and asked Governor Brown to send a company of militia. Governor Brown dispatched two companies to Oscilia today.

Bostwick was arrested some time ago for assault to commit murder. He was released on bond, but his bondsmen withdrew Sunday. It was when officers tried to re-arrest him that Bostwick opened fire. His four small children were in the house during the shooting.

## BURNED TO DEATH UNDER HIS AUTO

[UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE.] St. Louis, Mo., June 27.—With onlookers unable to give any assistance, Robert O. Abel, aged 21, burned to death in the wreck of an automobile here today and his brother, Fred Abel, and a friend, Harry Jewson, were seriously injured.

The automobile overturned and pinned Robert Abel beneath it. The wreck was soon enveloped in flames and passersby who endeavored to rescue Abel were driven away by the heat.

## Italy Will Not Insist On It.

[UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE.] Rome, June 27.—Although Italy intends to demand the extradition of Porter Charlton to face trial for the murder of his wife at Lake Como, it is understood that the government will not press the demand. It is believed that the refusal of the American authorities to transfer Charlton would cause no regret, as it would sustain the action of Italy in refusing to grant the extradition of Italians wanted in America for high crimes.

## Harvard a Favorite.

[UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE.] New London, Conn., June 27.—The variety boat crews of Harvard and Yale began final practice today for their championship contests on Thursday. Harvard is a 3 to 2 betting favorite in the eight-oared race. The odds are even that Harvard will win all three races.

The members of the Harvard crew are all veterans, while Yale has but two veterans.

## DIAZ AGAIN IS ELECTED PRESIDENT

MEXICAN ELECTIONS, THOUGH, ARE THE PERSONIFICATION OF THE ASSEMBLY IDEA—THE SLATE GOES THROUGH REGARDLESS OF THE PEOPLE.

[UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE.] Mexico City, June 27.—The election of Diaz as president and Corral as vice-president of Mexico yesterday will be formally ratified by the chamber of deputies on July 10. Diaz was unopposed, and, contrary to predictions, there was no disorder.

Owing to the existing feeling against President Diaz it is believed this will be his last term. It is predicted by politicians that Felix Diaz will be appointed governor of Vera Cruz, and that in 1916 Corral will seek the presidency, and Felix Diaz the vice-presidency.

Their election would mean a perpetuation of the Diaz Policies.

## FLYER DELAYED BY BAD WEATHER

[UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE.] Berlin, June 28.—Storms delayed the Pan-Germanic aerial liner Deutschland from sailing today and there is a belief that the undertaking to run the airship on regular passenger trips will prove failure.

After two successful trips the Deutschland has lain idle for three days owing to unfavorable weather. Many persons who bought tickets in advance are expressing dissatisfaction with the unreliability of aerial craft.
