Hooper in Wartburg

Discussed National and State Issues to a Large and En- thusiastic Audience

Without doubt the largest gathering of the Republican voters that Morgan County has seen for many years came together at Wartburg from every section of the County on Saturday last to listen to Ex-Governor Hooper speak on the issues of the campaign.

The Court room which will seat some 500 was filled to overflowing, standing room being at a premium and the anterooms and hall called into requisition to accommodate those anxious to hear their candidate for United States Senator. Some two hundred listened outside being unable to get in.

President Stricklin of the Wartburg Central Republican Club called the large gathering to order, and in a few well chosen remarks called Hon. S H Jestes to the chair who in a short but eloquent speech introduced the speaker of the day Ex-Governor Hooper, who on taking the platform was greeted with hearty cheers.

Mr Hooper entered into the subject in his old time vim and vigor and from the start to the end had his audience with him.

He discussed national and state issues and paid his respects to both Rye and McKellar, and in conclusion predicted a sweeping victory for the Republican party in November.
