

LOOKS BAD FOR MURRAY

Rev. O. E. Murray, Banker, of Bijou Hills Sued for Seduction
The subjoined special from Wagner appeared in the Sioux Falls Argus-Leader of the 28th:

H. A. Schmidt, a prominent German farmer residing near Academy, in this county, has commenced an action against O. E. Murray of Bijou Hills for \$5,000 damages for the seduction of his minor daughter, Clara Schmidt. H. D. James, an attorney for Schmidt, had papers served on Murray in this county in the action several days ago, and the case will be brought on trial at the next term of circuit court for Charles Mix county.

Murray is a married man and a prominent citizen of Bijou Hills and is engaged in the banking business at that place. He is a highly educated man and is also a minister of the gospel and has frequently filled the pulpit at Bijou Hills and a Academy, this county. He came to Bijou Hills about a year ago. Since coming there himself and wife have been very prominent in social affairs, taking an active part in church work.

According to the complaint of Schmidt his daughter, Clara Schmidt, who is a minor of the age of 17 years, was employed as a domestic in the home of the defendant last November, and that the defendant accomplished her ruin, and as a result the girl is about to become a mother.

Murray vehemently denies the charge, and the case will be vigorously fought on both sides. Owing to the prominence of the defendant in this county, the case will attract a good deal of attention. The sentiment of the people in the vicinity of Bijou Hills is rather against Murray in the matter.

The Mitchell Republican adds the following: Mrs. Murray was in the city last week and in conversation with some friends she stated that this trouble grew out of some affairs in connection with the bank at Bijou Hills. The bank, she said, held some of Schmidt's paper on which the interest was back a year or more and Mr. Murray had made efforts to force a settlement of the same but no success had been attained.

In order to prevent further trouble about the note Schmidt, it is alleged, trumped up this charge in order to make Mr. Murray desist in attempting to collect the interest or principal that was due. Some years ago Mr. Murray was a resident of Mitchell when he attended the college and later years he entered the ministry, preaching near Chicago, and in the past two or three years he conducted a big church in the mining district of Illinois, near Joliet. When he first entered the ministry he preached in the Methodist church, but later gave it up for the Congregation denomination.

This information will be very much of a surprise to those who knew Mr. Murray and they will be loth to believe the charge to be true.


