Base Ball

Crack Richmond Twirler Will Go to the Southern League Next Season.

Mack Allison, the former star twirler of the Richmond Blue Grass League team will not go to the Memphis Southern League team but will be seen with the San Antonio Texas League outfit during the coming season. Allison had signed a contract to play with Memphis but he was not released by the Richmond management until the drafting season was over and he was drafted by San Antonio.

A dispatch from Lexington says there seems to be a probability that Newport will be in the Blue Grass Base Ball League next season, and there is also a possibility that Covington will have a team in this league. In that event the league will make an eight club circuit and the Blue Grass League, which has heretofore been confined to Central Kentucky, would largely increase its importance and prestige. The management of the Newport club is anxious to buy a franchise from one of the present members or otherwise enter the Blue Grass League, but the stumbling block for the present is President Garry Hermann, of Cincinnati, of the National Commission who has refused the request of Newport to enter the Blue Grass League, at least at the present time.

School News.

The county schools will close this week a most profitable season, and one very gratifying to Supt. John Noland and the county Board. At Berea the common school runs seven months, which is the only one in the county. This will close in January. Supt. Noland will wind up his visits to the schools this week.

So far only one teacher has signified her intention of leaving the school room in the county, Miss Lucy Noe, of Paint Lick, who has been teaching at the High Point school. She was married a few days ago to Mr. John Rupe, of that section, and her many co-workers will join the Climax in wishing them a long life of happiness. Supt. Noland says that heaviness feels very uneasy at the close of the term each year, when the phone rings, thinking it is one of his able teachers having decided that matrimony was ahead of the school room, and offering her or his resignation.

Saturday the 10th was a big day with the teachers of the county, for they were given two months pay and the Christmas money will sure come in handily. Supt. Noland received a check for \$9,600. The last payment is made in January and this will run until then. Out of this amount there are 25 colored teachers and 79 white, that receive from \$35. to \$60. per month.

Scarlet fever has been raging in the High Point school district and although it is but a few days until the close, the trustees may be compelled to shut down a week earlier. No fatalities have been reported as yet.
