

MRS. HETTY GREEN IS STILL AT ODDS WITH OLD BANK

Wall Street Wonders as "Make Up" Is Delayed, Also as to Cause of Trouble.

THAT IS CLOSE SECRET.

Richest Woman Retains Chemical Employee as Her "Business Secretary."

Financial sharps in Wall street are looking on in amused wonder at the continued strained relations between Mrs. Hetty Green and the Chemical National Bank, an institution that she had used without let or stint for over a quarter of a century. Speculation as to the final outcome rather favors the bank.

Mrs. Green to-day closed her apartment at No. 1309 Bloomfield street, Hoboken, and came to town on a visit to her daughter, Mrs. Matthew Astor Wilks, of No. 40 Madison avenue. Mrs. Green will not take a permanent residence in New York for the very best reason in the world—personal taxes and the Manhattan Board of Assessors.

Anyhow, Mrs. Green is a bona fide resident of New Jersey, for she has a country home near Englewood. Hence her trips to Manhattan will have the legal character of "visits."

Just at present Mrs. Green is having a period of forgetfulness as to the existence of the Chemical National Bank, No. 70 Broadway, where she formerly maintained a safety deposit box, and from which institution she transacted her loan business for twenty-four years. The richest woman in the world does not have an office—she is like the Curb offshoot of the New York Stock Exchange, and transacts her affairs from where she may stand when a proposition is presented for her decision.

Moved to National Park. Two months ago Mrs. Green ceased to keep her mortgages and stocks and bonds at the Chemical. She surrendered the key to her safety deposit box, and transferred all of her securities to the safety deposit vaults of the National Park Bank, No. 114 Broadway. Here Mrs. Green was given the use of an office over the bank, her nearest neighbor being another tenant, Stuyvesant Fish.

Eleven years ago the Chemical National Bank assigned one of its most valued and faithful employees to the beck and call of Mrs. Green. This man is Newton B. Phelps, the clean cut young man who can be seen any day in the company of Mrs. Green, either on the marble steps leading to the main floor of the National Park Bank or in an ante-room to the left as one enters the Title Guarantee and Trust Company, No. 128 Broadway, where Mrs. Green concludes many of her real estate transactions.

Mr. Phelps has come to be looked upon as a "business secretary" to Mrs. Green but it is not generally known that he is on the payroll of the Chemical National Bank.

The courtesy of the officers of the

Chemical National Bank to customers is one of the traditions of the financial world. There is not an institution in the country that goes further in acts of genuine consideration for depositors. Mrs. Green had enjoyed these courtesies for many years, and while her balances were small indeed for a woman of her great means—her money works all the time—she became so identified with the bank in the popular mind that it was often referred to as "Hetty Green's bank."

Cause of Break a Secret. Then came an incident the character of which is still a carefully guarded secret. Some ascribed it to the fight between E. H. Harriman and Stuyvesant Fish for control of the Illinois Central. Others put it to decided views Mrs. Green held concerning certain financiers in Wall street. Very probably the actual cause of the break was a trifling matter, perhaps a fancied slight on the part of Mrs. Green.

Mrs. Green got out. She tripped down Broadway with her stocks, bonds and mortgages. The National Park Bank took her in. Green and the National Chemical Bank came to the parting of the ways. Wall street has speculated as to how Mrs. Green would get over her rift and return to her old bank. Some weeks ago, when the Evening World exclusively announced that Mrs. Green was housed in new banking quarters, there were details issued that any breach existed between her and her old bankers. But time has failed to heal the wound, and this wonderful woman, who still appears in person the value of every piece of real estate upon which she makes a loan, herself has said to intimate friends that she will remain in her present quarters.

"It is true that the Chemical National Bank has an extensive claim for past services against Mrs. Green, which has been presented," was asked today

of President Porter, by an Evening World reporter. "Such a report is an absolute untruth," was his reply. "However, I do not care to discuss the relations between the bank and its depositors."

SUFFRAGETTES GO TO JAIL.

Eleven Arrested in Parliament. Ruled Refuse to Give Bonds.

LONDON, March 31.—The proceedings in the Bow Street Police Court to-day in connection with the raid on the House of Commons yesterday of a band of twenty-seven women suffragists followed the ordinary lines.
