THE ROBERTS CASE. Possibly Two Reports, But Both Against the Mormon. WASHINGTON, D. C., January 2.—The report of the committee of the House of Representatives which is investigating the case of Mr. Roberts, of Utah, will be made soon after Congress reassembles, and there is reason to believe the majority report will recommend that Roberts be excluded from the House, and that he be not permitted, under his credentials, to exercise any public office of being sworn in.

Whether the report will be unanimous is open to doubt, as three of the members of the committee are not counted on as positively favoring the course indicated, and this may result in the submission of a minority report. The minority view, if submitted, will probably deal with the prima facie right to be sworn in on credentials which are regular, and will recommend that Roberts be sworn in and thereafter expelled.
