BIENNIAL REPORT OF VETERINARIAN

Dr. A. C. Young Recommends That Further Efforts Be Made to Stamp Out Disease.

Greater effort directed toward stamping out tuberculosis among cattle and glanders among horses is recommended in the biennial report of Dr. A. C. Young, state veterinarian, which was submitted to Governor William Spry yesterday. He also advised that owners of horses and cattle that have to be disposed of owing to the diseases be remunerated to some extent for their losses.
