BRAWLEY TOWNSITE

Frank S. Miller Purchases It And Will Build Town

Frank S. Miller, of Cleveland, Ohio, has purchased the Brawley townsite and will at once assume personal management. He has some ambitious projects on foot for promoting the place, and has had it newly platted. Imperial avenue runs north and south through the town, with Main Street running east and west. Mesquite avenue runs diagonally from the northwest to the southeast corner and Brawley avenue from the southwest to the northeast corner. Each of these avenues is 100 feet wide. Other streets in the town run toward the cardinal points of the compass, those running east and west being lettered and the ones running north and south being numbered. Six parks are provided, including a plaza in the center of the town, which will at once be planted to a large variety of trees. Mr. Miller calls the town the Redlands of the Imperial Valley, and will make the most of the favorable locality for making a town.

There are certain to be a number of thriving towns in the valley, and Brawley is well situated to be one of them.
