MORE BIG SALES

Property in El Centro and Close to Town is Demanding High Prices

Real estate transfers and the prices of property is one of the very best indicators as to which is the favorite place to invest in real estate, and it also shows how the buyers feel regarding the present campaign which some of the towns of the valley are now conducting. For the past three months the sale of town lots in El Centro has been steadily on the increase, but the last week has shown a decidedly healthy growth, and especially is this true of farm lands close to town.

Last week H. C. Griswold sold to James W. Walde, of San Diego, 100 acres off the Balcom ranch just west of town. This 100 acres was taken from the south side of the tract and is quite a little way from the center of town. The sale was for practically all cash and the 100 acres brought \$10,000. This is the highest price ever paid in the valley for a tract as large as this. Three and six acre tracts of land adjoining the townsite have brought as high as \$220 an acre. It is considered that the gentleman from San Diego made a remarkably good buy.

The owner of the corner lot just east of the Valley State Bank building was offered and refused \$4000 for his lot. The man who made the offer is a valley man and has had a chance to learn about how things are going over the rest of the valley. Less than two years ago this lot sold for \$1000.

Town lots are selling very fast, and the list of property owners is growing quite lengthy. Parties from all over the valley are taking the opportunity to purchase lots now while they can get them at the original price, for it is a known fact that the present prices will not long continue so low as they are now.

Whereas, In the judgment of the board of trustees of El Centro school district, in the county of San Diego, state of California, it is advisable to call an election and submit to the electors of said district the question of voting a special tax to the amount of (\$1500) Fifteen Hundred dollars, to furnish school facilities for the school district to maintain a school, for building and furnishing a school house.

Now, therefore, it is hereby ordered—
First—That such election be and the same is hereby called to be held on the 10th day of August, 1907, between the hours of 11 o'clock a. m. and 3 o'clock p. m. of said day, at the school house in said district.

Second—That the following named persons be and they are hereby appointed officers to conduct the said election, viz: J. E. Tout as judge and A. Sheppard as judge and F. G. Havens as inspector.

Third—That such election be called by posting notices signed by this board, in three of the most public places in the district, viz: Public school house, post office and at cross roads west of town for not less than twenty days before the election and that such notice be published in the Imperial Valley Press, a newspaper printed and published in said San Diego county, not less than once a week for three successive weeks prior to the date of holding such election.
