

SIXTEEN DIE IN AN EXPLOSION

PITTSFIELD, Mass., Dec. 29.—The lives of sixteen workmen were ended today by the explosion of a boiler at the plant of the Woodford Lake Ice company at Morewood, two miles south of here. Twelve men were instantly killed, one died shortly after the accident, and three others died in the hospital. In addition twelve men were injured and it was said at the House of Mercy, the hospital to which they were removed, that two of the patients may die.

INDICTMENT ON CHARGE OF LARCENY

NEW YORK, Dec. 29.—It took the grand jury just an hour today to indict Joseph G. Robin on a charge of the larceny of \$30,000 from the Washington Savings bank, of which he was president. The savings bank passed into the hands of the state banking department today, there to keep company with the bank of Northern New York, of whose executive committee he was chairman, and with which his name has hitherto been more prominently connected. The district attorney explained that out of a mass of evidence drawn from the records of both institutions he had chosen the charge that he thought could be presented most simply to a jury. Robin now under arrest. Robin was immediately placed under arrest at the home of his sister, Dr. Louise Robinovitch, but his arraignment will be postponed until tomorrow, when he must give \$25,000 bail or go to jail. Technically Robin is insane. The order of commitment signed by Justice Amend, at the request of Dr. Robinovitch, and on the certification of three other physicians, still stands, although the private sanitarium to which Robin was taken refused to receive him. "This lunacy finding is the thing that complicates the case," said District Attorney Whitman today. "If Mr. Jerome would consent to waive that finding it would greatly simplify matters."

STATE AUDITOR FILES REPORT

SALT LAKE, Dec. 29.—Utah has spent much more money during the biennium covered by the report of State Auditor Jesse D. Jewkes, just filed with Governor William Spry, than during the preceding biennium or any previous two years since statehood. However, the state has been able to spend more, for despite the increased disbursements, the state's balance sheet shows an increased margin between it and the red column of deficits. This development has not been above normal in some departments and below normal in others, but is shown to prevail throughout all departments. Indebtedness which has been contracted by the state board of loan commissioners in the past and which fell due on November 30, 1910, has been met and this unusual condition must be taken into consideration in studying the report. These amounts included in the expenditures and the amounts of outstanding warrants for the biennium deducted, the state still has a balance in the treasury \$856,729.21 greater than the balance shown at the beginning of the two-year period. In 1909 the total receipts from all sources aggregated \$2,938,716.61 and in 1910, \$3,121,409.76. The receipts show an increase of 25 per cent. ARCH HOXSEY FLIES OVER MT. WILSON

AVIATION FIELD, Los Angeles, Cal., holder of the present world record for altitude of 11,474 feet, today flew over Mt. Wilson, the highest peak of the mountain range, which rims the valley in which Los Angeles, Pasadena and the towns of the orange belt lie. Under ideal weather conditions he soared 10,005 feet into the air and cleared the crest of Mt. Wilson, with 4,200 feet to spare. Could Transport Armies. Lieutenant Vernon Bolter and several other army officers, who are here to see the sights, were quick to observe in Hoxsey's performance a new way of transporting armies across mountain ranges, and predicted the early relegation of the army mule as an essential in scaling heights. Lieutenant Bolter, who came here from Fort Whipple, Ariz., said that a new kind of airplane could transport an army of 10,000 men across mountains as high as the Alps in a day. Hoxsey used a heavy stock Wright biplane, equipped for passenger duty, and he made the journey from the field to a point beyond the mountains in one hour and 28 minutes. The distance is estimated at 24 miles. On an air line the distance from the field to the mountains is less than that, but Hoxsey circled over the field until he had reached his maximum height before he pointed the nose of his machine toward the range. He was out of sight of the crowd before he made the attempt at topping the peak. Liked the Trip. The news of his success was flashed to aviation field by telephone from the Carnegie Solar observatory on Mt. Wilson and directly above which the aviator soared. "It was awfully cold, and when I got to a point just above the summit I found that the horizon, which obscured the mountains from the aviation field was a heavy wall of vapor, filled with fine ice particles that stung my face. I am certain that if I had had a recording thermometer with me it would have shown the temperature of the upper altitude to be far below zero. However, hurdlings mountains is much easier than climbing 11,000 feet over a valley or the sea. The earth does not seem so far away."
