UP IN PENNSYLVANIA.

Franklin, Pa., June 22.—(Special Correspondence)—What was probably the most remarkable county convention ever held in the United States occurred here last Saturday. In the big crowd which gathered were ninety-two regularly elected delegates from thirty-seven precincts in the county. There was tremendous enthusiasm and a determination to carry this county for the Prohibition party next fall. At night there was a giant mass meeting with brass bands and a torch light procession. Some of the best posted men in this city say there isn't much doubt about the Prohibitionists having a swooping victory in the country. The vote last year for president was, McKinley, 5931, Bryan, 4014 and Woolley, 1284. Forty-three local candidates were elected in the county last February. Homer L. Castle, of Pittsburg was the chief orator at night. A special train loaded with Oil City Prohibitionists came down for the evening rally. The Evening Leader, a Democratic paper, defies the Democratic party and may support the Prohibition candidates. In a two and a half column report of the county convention it says among other things: "Hundreds of old party voters, feeling themselves disgraced by the actions of the parties to which they have hitherto belonged are leaving forever their treacherous leaders and uniting themselves with the greatest political party this nation has ever seen. All over Venango county the great topic of conversation is the wonderful growth of the Prohibition party. The tremendous enthusiasm of its members and the marked contrast between the purity of its methods and political methods with those of the old parties. Everywhere men are saying to each other that the time has come at last when the long fight of the Prohibition party against the corrupt and soul-destroying power of the saloon, is to be crowned with success. Prohibition success is in the air and no power on earth can stop it."

Already about ten counties have put out local candidates and more to follow.
