Interference With Marshal at Other Officers. Be it ordained by the Mayor and council of the town of Punta Gorda, Florida: That any person or persons interfering with the marshal or any officer in the town of Punta Gorda, Florida, in the performance of their duties shall be fined not less than ten dollars, nor more than one hundred dollars, or be imprisoned in the jail of the town of Punta Gorda, not exceeding sixty days, or by both fine and imprisonment, at the discretion of the mayor.

Indigent exposure of person, obscene and profane language, drunk and disorderly. Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the town of Punta Gorda, Florida: That any person or persons found guilty of indigent exposure of person, or obscene or profane language, or any person or persons found drunk and disorderly within the corporate limits of the town of Punta Gorda, Florida, shall be fined not less than ten dollars, nor more than fifty dollars, or be imprisoned in the jail of the town of Punta Gorda, not exceeding sixty days, or by both fine and imprisonment, at the discretion of the mayor.

Obstructing sidewalk, or ditches and streets.
