Seven to Three.

The best indication that farming conditions are improving is that the accomplishments of the farm are beginning to figure in the news. The following news item is given as much prominence as would a senator's views on the tariff, and it is really of more importance:

"By combining thorough tillage, crop rotation, barnyard fertilizer and a judicious use of commercial fertilizer, W. H. Dubose of Brundidge, Ala., has succeeded in producing seven bales of cotton from a three-acre tract, using nothing but the ordinary cotton seed; the cost per acre being \$38.50, as follows: Breaking the land, \$3.50; rebedding, \$2.00; hoeing, \$1.50; cultivating, \$8.00; picking, \$16.00; ginning, \$4.50; hauling, \$3.00.

"On the three acres Mr. Dubose cleared over \$450."

At the beginning of this new year would it not be a step in the right direction for all of us as we are tempted to criticise our neighbors to get thoroughly into our hearts the truth that there are "two sides" and that after all we hear we really know precious little of the burdens that the men and women about us are carrying every day.
