THE KATY EXTENSION.

New Braunfels late Saturday afternoon closed her contract with her contract with the Missouri, Kansas & Texas Railway company of Texas for the immediate construction of the San Marcos-San Antonio extension as far as New Braunfels.

It took \$22,000 cash money to close the deal, but through the activity of such men as Messrs. Lando and Clements, the thriving, solid little city on the banks of the Comal raised the money required, and the deal was accordingly closed last Saturday afternoon. The railway company now agrees to begin the construction into New Braunfels immediately. The securing of the necessary right of way will begin Monday. The transaction New Braunfels Saturday were conducted between the two railroad committees of the citizens part of New Braunfels and Messrs. Sommerfeld and Fratt, representing the Katy. The depot grounds will be located opposite Landa's oil mill, on the Comal. Dirt will fly September 1, and trains will be running within seven months.—S. A. Express, Aug. 26.

Prizes in Tobacco Trade.

The commissioner of internal revenue at Washington has issued a circular, prohibiting the use by manufacturers of cigars, cigarettes or tobacco when put up in statutory packages, of labels containing "any promise or offer of, or any order or certificate for, any gift, prize, premium, payment or reward." This regulation takes effect today. The order will not prevent manufacturers from sending prize coupons to retailers for dissemination among purchasers of their goods, but is designed to prohibit the use of the statutory package as a distributor of gift enterprise.
