

NEW GAME LAWS OF TEXAS FOR BENEFIT OF SPORTSMEN

The following brief resume of the game laws of Texas will interest local sportsmen:

Deer.—Unlawful to hunt, kill snare or trap between Jan. 1 and Sept. 1, or to hunt with any hunting lamp, artificial lamp or lantern.

Antelope.—Unlawful to kill wild antelope until 1904; after that date unlawful to hunt or kill between Jan. 1 and Sept. 1.

Mongolian or English pheasants.—Killing forbidden until 1904.

Wild turkeys.—Unlawful to kill between April 1 and Sept. 1.

Prairie Chickens, Pinnated Grouse.—Unlawful to kill between Feb. 1 and Aug. 1.

Quail or Partridge.—Unlawful to kill between March 25 and Oct. 1.

Sale, Purchase or Transportation.—Unlawful to sell, purchase, or have in possession for sale, purchase, any wild deer or antelope, or the carcass or fresh hide thereof, of any wild turkeys, prairie chickens, pinnated grouse, wild

Mongolian or English pheasant, plover, snipe or jacksnipe, except that sale and purchase of these animals is not unlawful if said sale or purchase is made in the county where game is killed or taken. The sale or shipment of wild ducks and wild geese is permitted. The transportation beyond the limits of this state of any animal, bird or fowl mentioned above, except wild ducks or geese, is a misdemeanor and is prohibited, except that live Mongolian or English pheasants may be shipped for scientific or breeding purposes.

Wild Fowl Methods.—Unlawful to destroy wild ducks or geese by any other means than a common shoulder gun.

Netting.—Netting of quails or partridges at any season of the year is forbidden.

Birds of Plume.—It is a misdemeanor to wilfully kill any pelican, egret, tern, sea gull, shearwater or heron, or to destroy or injure the nests or eggs thereof.

WEEKLY COTTON CROP STATEMENT

Cotton Has Deteriorated During Week.—Little Change.

Washington, Sept. 8.—Complaints of rust and shedding are general throughout the cotton belt, and as a result the condition of cotton has deteriorated during the past week. The staple is opening rapidly, in some sections prematurely, and picking is becoming general in all districts. Favorable reports are received from North Carolina, Oklahoma and portions of South Carolina and Mississippi, prospects being good for a top crop in the first named state. While the boll worms have mostly disappeared, boll weevils continue destructive and are puncturing nearly all new forms in the southwestern, central and eastern sections, and the crop is also suffering from drouth in the northern and western portions of that state (Texas), which retards fruiting and causes much shedding.

The condition of the cotton crop in Texas has not changed materially since last week. Boll worms have already disappeared and are doing very little damage; the crop in the west and north is generally suffering from drouth, which is causing much shedding and is also greatly retarding fruiting. In the southwest, central and east portions there is generally sufficient moisture, but weevils are puncturing the forms as soon as they appear. The leaf worm is reported from several localities. The weather conditions were favorable for opening and picking is becoming general.

THIRTY KILLED.

Rioting at Beirut Results in Thirty Christians Being Killed.

Berlin, Sept. 8.—A dispatch to the Lokal Anzeiger from Constantinople says that thirty Christians, among them several Europeans, were killed during the rioting at Beirut. The foreign office here has received no news tending to confirm the report published by the Lokal Anzeiger.
