Majority of the Stores Will Close—Shopping Must Be Done Tonight.

Monday will be labor day, and the merchants and business men of Juneau will generally take a holiday. All stores will be closed, many for the entire day, and all government offices and the offices of the Territorial officials. The postoffice will close, with the exception of the general delivery window which will be open for one hour, from noon to 1 o'clock. The courts will remain closed for the entire day.

The schools of Juneau have declared a holiday, both the public and the St. Ann Parochial school. The children will enjoy a full day of play and return to their lessons on Tuesday morning. Many picnics and hunting parties are being planned. Several hunting parties will leave Juneau tonight and remain out for two days, returning to the city on Monday night.

SOLDIERS OF FRANCE MUST USE A RAZOR

Army Orders Destroying Natural Ambush of the Men—Much Humor Brought Out.

PARIS, Aug. 24.—(Special)—The beard of the French soldier is doomed in an army order directing that the men at the front shave all but mustaches. The order brought an outburst of humorous and ironic discussions in the trench newspapers to which some of the famous French artists, philosophers and literary men have contributed.

Joan Richepin, the dramatist, writing in the Fuse, says: "The beard is gone, but what is the difference to us? In place of it is courage that grows. Let the beard fall and French courage grow."

Edmond Rostand celebrates the beard in verse as a symbol of "all beauty of all France, a soul, a jewel, a torch, a prod."

Henri Bergson says: "I am not afraid to go as far as to say that a visage is matter while the beard is mind." Relieves Army of "Useless Weight" August Rodin, the sculptor, says: "Men without beards, women without sex, statues without heads, bodies without arms, humanity without weakness, that is my opinion."

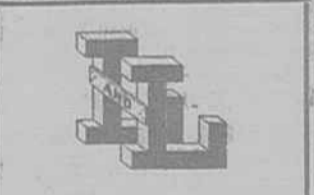

AGREEMENT REACHED BETWEEN DUTCH AND BRITISH FISHERMEN

Fishing Boats Are to Be Released—Germany Is Cut off with a Small Catch.

LONDON, Sept. 2.—The Daily Mail says an agreement has been signed between the Dutch Fishing Association and the British government regarding the future disposal of herring catches, and providing for the release of about 120 to 150 Dutch fishing boats which have been laid up in Scottish ports for nine weeks. The vessels will be released, the paper says, on condition that Germany shall receive no more than 20 per cent of the season's catch. Holland will retain another 20 per cent for home consumption, while the remaining 60 per cent will be sold to neutral countries only.

On every barrel of this 60 per cent the British government agrees to pay a bonus of thirty shillings to the Dutch owners. The paper says that fishermen believe America will get most of the 60 per cent, which goes to neutrals.
