She was to have called at Yakutat and Agent Ewing thinks that she may have stopped to pick up the crew of the wrecked Oakland.

There is a possibility that the Yukon may have stopped at Katalla to pick up Dr. John Holmes, director of the bureau of mines, and party comprising about 40 people, sent out by the government to mine a thousand tons of coal on the Cunningham group.
