Indian Witnesses Getting Meal Tickets

The court is still occupied with several cases wherein defendants are charged with selling liquor to Indians. The grand jury reported yesterday at four p. m.

The jury found not a true bill in the case of John Radcliff brought from Haines.

True bills were found against Harvey Smith, of Juneau; Jose Redriquez, and Teodoro Lucero, of Ketchikan; also against W. C. Coffey, A. Bedwell and Henry Weber, of Haines.

The jury retired and reported again this morning but were excused because there was no business.

This morning Harvey Smith (true name Henry Wayant), Jose Redriquez and Teodoro Lucero were arraigned. The two first named had no attorney and did not desire any.

The court appointed J. Hellenenthal for Lucero, Coffey, Bedwell, and Weber all charged on the same indictment were also arraigned and John R. Winn was appointed their attorney by the court.

John Williams entered a plea of not guilty and his trial set for Monday next, following the trial of Jimmie James. Al Lundgren, Anthony Kelly and Dick Manson also entered pleas of not guilty and trials were set for Monday to follow in the order in which their names appear.

Court adjourned until tomorrow at 10 a. m., except as to receiving reports from the grand jury.

Notes: Howard Ashley a petit juror, drawn from Skagway, was excused by the court without making an appearance.

The grand jury is very busy this afternoon on an important case.
