DIPHTHERIA CASES CAUSING ANXIETY

This morning Alfred Lundstrom, assistant city wharfinger, who has been on a trip to Sitka, returned on the Georgia. Mr. Lundstrom says that diphtheria is prevalent in Sitka. Three houses are now affected, two of them being homes of natives, the other that of white people. In Hoonah Mr. Lundstrom says there are two cases of the disease.

Today Marshal Faulkner received another wire from Deputy John Goodell, at Sitka, stating that the diphtheria case was getting more serious. He has several people under quarantine and is forced to stand all the expense from his own personal account. Marshal Faulkner says there are no funds and one of the most urgent needs is legislation to correct the situation.

SOLDIERS FIGHT FOR NEW TRIAL

This morning Judge Overfield listened to arguments on the motion of Gunnison & Marshal, attorneys for Paris, Parent and Collander for a new trial. The defendants are the three soldiers recently convicted of complicity in the highway robbery at Haines. In support of the motion a number of affidavits were filed setting forth alleged facts which the defense argues is of material importance as bearing on the guilt or innocence of defendants. District Attorney Rustgard opposed the granting of the new trial and asserted that the alleged new evidence was rather in the nature of impeaching evidence and was not sufficient for the granting of a new trial. The court took the matter under advisement.
