SHIPPING COPPER FROM SKAGWAY
 The Hon. J. M. Tanner, Senator-elect from Skagway to Alaska's first legislature arrived in Juneau on the Georgia last night. "Everybody is cheerful in the Gate City," said the Senator, "and the Gem of Alaska is beginning to scintillate."
 "While there is nothing to warrant the statement that a boom is imminent, we are prosperous and healthy. There isn't an idle man in Skagway. Nearly all of the young men have taken to railroading and are working steady."
 There is considerable activity in the shipment of copper. The America is now loading 2,400 tons of ore and the Washington will load 1,500 tons as soon as she finishes discharging coal for the town. The Cordova, it is said will touch at Skagway on the return trip from the Westward and finish her load with the Skagway ores. All of the copper is shipped to the Tacoma smelter.
