**Sec. Tumulety's Large Family Doesn't Worry Him**

Tactful, yet a fighter; intensely loyal, yet independent; a "good fellow," yet a model family man, is the way in which Joseph P. Tumulty, whom President-elect Woodrow Wilson has selected to his private secretary, is described by those who have known him most of the thirty-eight years since he was born in the Fifth Ward of Jersey City.

Mr. Tumulty comes of a race of politicians, and when he begins to earn his salary of \$7,500 a year in Washington place seekers and other politicians between whom the President-elect will have to stand as a buffer will find he is one of those who can say no gracefully and stick to it.

Gov. Wilson knows this, for Mr. Tumulty has been his secretary at Trenton. What the Governor did not know about the politicians of the State the blond young Irishman did, and when the Governor decided upon a course of action he found he could depend upon Tumulty to carry out his plans regardless of opposition.

It was not until he was nominated for Governor that Dr. Wilson met Mr. Tumulty. The young man had previously served four terms in the Assembly under the patronage of the then powerful Bob Davis, boss of Hudson County, retiring when he found that his independence in legislative matters and his refusal to blindly follow the order of Davis had so seriously impaired his law practice that it was necessary for him to quit politics to make proper provision for himself and his family.

It was that independence that first attracted the attention of Dr. Wilson to him, and after becoming thoroughly acquainted with him in the campaign of 1910, he made him his private secretary. Subsequently he was given the position of clerk of the Supreme Court though he continued to fulfill the duties of his former office without pay.

Mr. Tumulty made his debut in politics in Jersey City while he was yet a student in St. Peter's College, addressing ward meetings here, there and everywhere for the Democratic ticket. He was a good talker—he won the gold for oratory in his class of 1898—and he continued speech making while he was studying law in the ensuing four years.

One year later he married Miss Mary Catherine Byrne, with whom he attended St. Bridget's Parochial School. They have six children—four girls and two boys—and Mr. Tumulty says the only drawback about politics is that it takes him away from the little ones too much.

Incidentally Mr. Tumulty is no believer in the thirteen superstition, he being one of thirteen children of Peter Tumulty, who served in the civil war in the Seventh New Jersey and was wounded and made a prisoner at the battle of Williamsburg.

**GREATEST FUNERAL VIENNA EVER SAW**

VIENNA, Feb. 28.—Franz Schuhmeier, the Socialist leader and a member of the Chamber of Deputies in the Austrian Diet, murdered last Tuesday night by Paul Kunschak, the Christian Socialist and labor leader, from motive of revenge, was buried yesterday in a manner usually reserved for monarchs. Undoubtedly the funeral was the most impressive Vienna ever saw.

More than half a million people attended it. So great was the multitude pouring into the city from every direction that the steam and street railways were utterly unable to handle the traffic. At least a hundred thousand people came to town afoot, regular processions streaming in from the remotest suburbs, many of the monarchs having walked five hours or more.

Deputations from Germany, Belgium, Italy and Hungary, representing the railways, trams, customs, fire brigades and working women, escorted the hearse to the cemetery, carrying several thousand wreaths with blood-red streamers. One was contributed by the New York German Socialists.

For miles around the cemetery the masses stood silent and attentive while Schuhmeier's body was lowered into the grave, which was filled up with red carnations thrown by friends and admirers.

**WILSON DECLINES TO JOIN A CLUB**

WASHINGTON, Feb. 27.—President-elect Wilson has declined an honorary membership in the Chevy Chase Club, on the ground that he expects to give all his time to public business.

**PASSES IT UP TO PRESIDENT-ELECT**

WASHINGTON, Feb. 27.—The question of the recognition of the provisional government of Mexico will be passed onto the Wilson administration, by President Taft. There is no pressing necessity for Mr. Taft to take action.
