Real estate prices have gone up, building work is in progress, the hotels are crowded and the houses filled. Appearances indicate that the boom is a lasting one, for the reason that the mining work in progress and planned is of a substantial character. Many new properties are being opened up near Juneau, among them some that will rival the Treadwell in immensity.—Fairbanks Times.
