FORMER PROSECUTOR CONDEMNS SYSTEM

NEW YORK, March 15.—"I do not think that Becker would be in the death cell at Sing Sing today if he had been subject to proper discipline," Eugene A. Philbin, former District Attorney for this county and now regent of the University of the State of New York, declared yesterday to the Wagner committee on remedial police legislation.

"I firmly believe," Mr. Philbin continued, "that if we had a proper administration and discipline of the police force the Becker case would never have occurred and that today we would not have the disorder that does exist notwithstanding the earnest efforts that Mr. Waldo is making, according to his understanding, in the way of gunmen, in the way of shooting, in the way of bombs that are being exploded in various places and all that."

WESTERN DEMOCRATS VISIT WITH PRESIDENT

A Washington dispatch of last Saturday to the Seattle Post-Intelligencer, says State Democratic Chairman Hugh C. Todd reached Washington today and, following a conference with National Committee Chairman John Patterson, Charles G. Helfner and other Washington politicians, it was announced that Judge F. A. McDonald would be recommended for postmaster at Seattle.

M. A. Langhorne, of Tacoma, will be recommended for United States attorney for Western Washington. Judge William Hickman Moore, of Seattle, is favored by Todd and Helfner for United States judge for Western Washington.

W. H. Merritt, of Seattle, who is a candidate for collector of customs, was turned down by Todd, Patterson and Helfner.

Pattison had a conference with Attorney-General McReynolds concerning the judgeship, but apparently without result. Another conference is to be held Monday.

The delegation also visited the secretary of war and wound up the day at the White House, where they were received by President Wilson. In the party which visited the executive mansion were Patterson, Todd Helfner, Miss Lucille Helfner, Mr. and Mrs. W. H. Cochran, of Spokane; R. W. Jennings, of Juneau, Alaska; Z. R. Cheney, national committeeman for Alaska; Charles Drury, of Tacoma, and Capt. A. M. Wilson, of Portland, second cousin of the President.
