**PACIFIC COAST DOCK TAKING ON BUSINESS AIRS**

The Pacific Coast dock from its crowded condition betokens that there is business in progress in and about Juneau. For several weeks huge piles of lumber belong to the Alaska-Gastineau Company have been gradually wearing down, but this morning the latest large cargo is being spread until travel by foot is even difficult between Front street and the warehouse. The Pacific Coast S. S. Meteor brought 1,500 tons of freight to Juneau. The cargo consisted of 160 tons of iron rails for the Alaska-Juneau Mining Company; 150,000 feet of lumber belonging to the Alaska-Gastineau Co.; 500 tons foreign house-coal, and 500 tons foreign steam-coal for Pacific Coast Co., all of which is being piled on the wharf with the exception of the nails and the coal.
